Broadly stated, the aim of the Graduate Research Seminar series is to allow graduate research students attached to the Department of Classics and Archaeology to present their work in progress to other research students and academic members of staff of the university, and to receive feedback from them. The idea is for students to present their research topic, in particular the methodology being adopted in their study, to discuss initial results, and to share concerns (if any) about the type and quality of data. The aim is to make the seminars a welcoming and supportive environment where students develop confidence, skills and a support network.

The seminars will be held at the Lecture Room of the Archaeology Centre and will last one hour, starting at 17.45. The time chosen should allow those students who are in full-time employment to attend the seminars. Graduate students are asked to prepare a presentation of 30-45 minutes and to allow ample time for discussion. It is recommended that students discuss the structure of their presentation with their supervisor/s.
