Renewal of the German Chair in Peace Studies and Conflict Prevention at MEDAC

On the 28th of September 2023, Ambassador Tanja I. Beyer, on behalf of the Federal Foreign Office of Germany and Professor Godfrey Pirotta, Chairperson of MEDAC, signed an extension of the agreement on the German Chair for Peace Studies and Conflict Prevention at the Mediterranean Academy of Diplomatic Studies. The signing took place in the presence of the Hon. Ian Borg, Minister for Foreign and European Affairs and Trade of Malta.

Prof. Stephen Calleya, Director of MEDAC, Dr. Monika Wohlfeld, holder of the German Chair and Mr. Ralf Eden, First Secretary, German Embassy in Malta were also present. The German Federal Foreign Office has been a stakeholder in MEDAC since 2009, when the German Chair for Peace Studies and Conflict Prevention was established. The continuation of the agreement on the Chair highlights Germany's commitment to the promotion of peace in the Mediterranean region.



Peace Mediation Seminar MEDAC and ZIF collaborate

In March 2023, MEDAC students participated in a three-day peace mediation training led by the Centre for International Peace Operations.

The Centre for International Peace Operations (ZIF) Berlin collaborated with the Mediterranean Academy of Diplomatic Studies at the University of Malta to train its postgraduate students - aspiring diplomats and civil society activists from the Mediterranean region and beyond - in the basics of peace mediation through a three-day certificate seminar. The multifaceted, tailormade program included an introduction to the basics of peace mediation, finalised by a full-scale simulation exercise on the third day. Participants gained insights into the modus operandi of internationally renowned peace mediation practitioners and completed an indepth module on Youth, Peace and Security.




