Academic Year 2016-2017

New students

The University of Malta starts its new Academic Year today, with over 3789¹ new students.

2648 students will be registering for undergraduate courses, while 1141 students will be reading for postgraduate degrees.

Another 1059 new students will be joining Junior College, to bring the total number of students to 2140.

International students

A total of 709 international students representing 85 different countries will be pursuing studies at the University this year.

Total number of students

The total number of students at the University of Malta for academic year 2016-2017 is 12101, of which 5068 are male and 7033 female, following a total of 873 courses.
