Professor Roderick Pace

Roderick Pace graduated BA (Hons) (Philosophy) from the University of Malta, MA in International Affairs from the Paul H. Nitze School of Advanced International Studies of the Johns Hopkins University, and Ph.D. in Politics from the University of Reading, UK. He joined the resident academic Staff of the University of Malta in July 1993. From 1987 to 1993 he was employed by the University as a part-time academic in charge of the European Documentation Centre (EDC) which was incorporated in the European Documentation and Research Centre (EDRC) whose statute was approved by the University of Malta in 1991. In October 2011, the Board decided to change the Centre's name to the **Institute for European Studies**. This decision was later ratified by the University Senate and Council in December 2011.

His main research interests are in World Politics, foreign policy analysis, Euro-Mediterranean relations, small states in world politics and the EU and last but not least Malta in the EU. He has also published works in the Theories of European Integration and Parliamentary Diplomacy.

Pace was Director of the institute from its inception to 2016, held a Jean Monnet Chair and since 2009 he has been a member of the editorial board of the journal *South European Society and Politics* edited by Susannah Verney and Ana Bosco published by Taylor and Francis, which is listed in the social sciences citation network (<https://www.tandfonline.com/toc/fses20/current>) (2017 IMPACT FACTOR 2.155).
