Summer School Objectives: Project EndCare is aimed at the harmonisation and dissemination of best practice in End of Life care across the European Union. Expert appraisals of the current positions on the medical, educational, psychological, legal, social, cultural, moral, ethical and spiritual aspects of EoL care will be presented during the summer school. This interdisciplinary approach focuses on bringing together different experiences in order to identify the practical difficulties faced in the implementation of decisions in EoL care.

Intended Participants: The summer school will be of particular interest to care givers engaged in the health sector, doctors, nurses, therapists, psychologists, social workers, those involved in palliative and spiritual care, and patient group representatives. Participants are expected to come from the fields of medicine, law, philosophy, theology, the social sciences, and from civil society.

Format: Following an introductory session for registered participants in the morning, the first two days of the five day course shall consist of a public conference featuring eminent keynote speakers and various expert contributors in related fields. The next three days will be exclusively dedicated to registered participants and will consist of both didactic and facilitative learning, focusing particularly on medical, moral, ethical, social and legal issues which impede the provision and practice of optimal care at the end of life.
