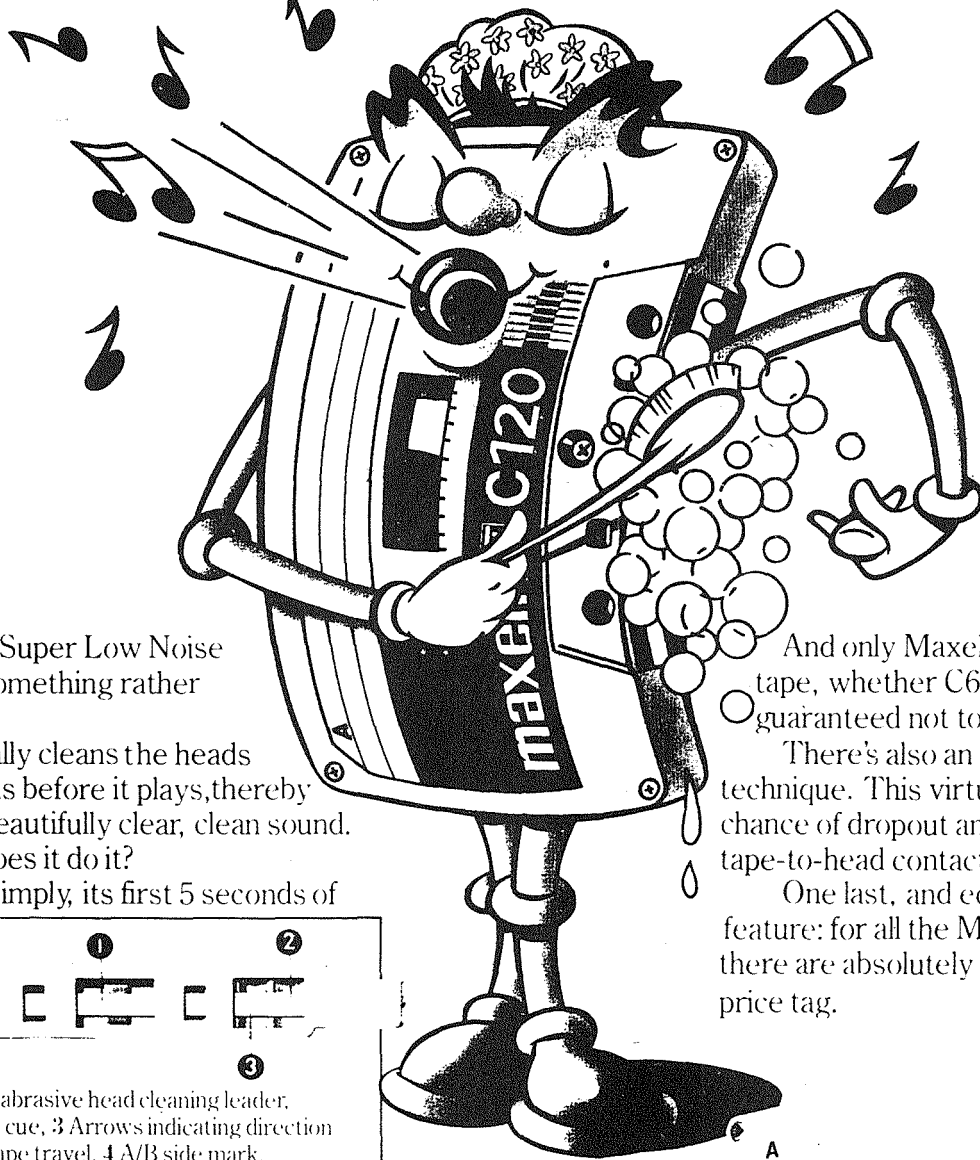

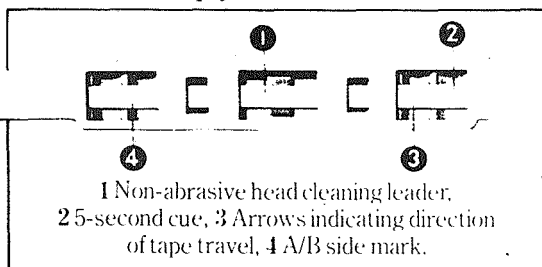

Il-kaz gara nhar il-Hamis, 26 ta' Gunju għal habta tat-3.15 a.m. meta spluzzjoni qawwiya hasdet mhux biss il-familja Laferla li dak il-hin kienu reqdin f'darhom, izda anke lill-girien.

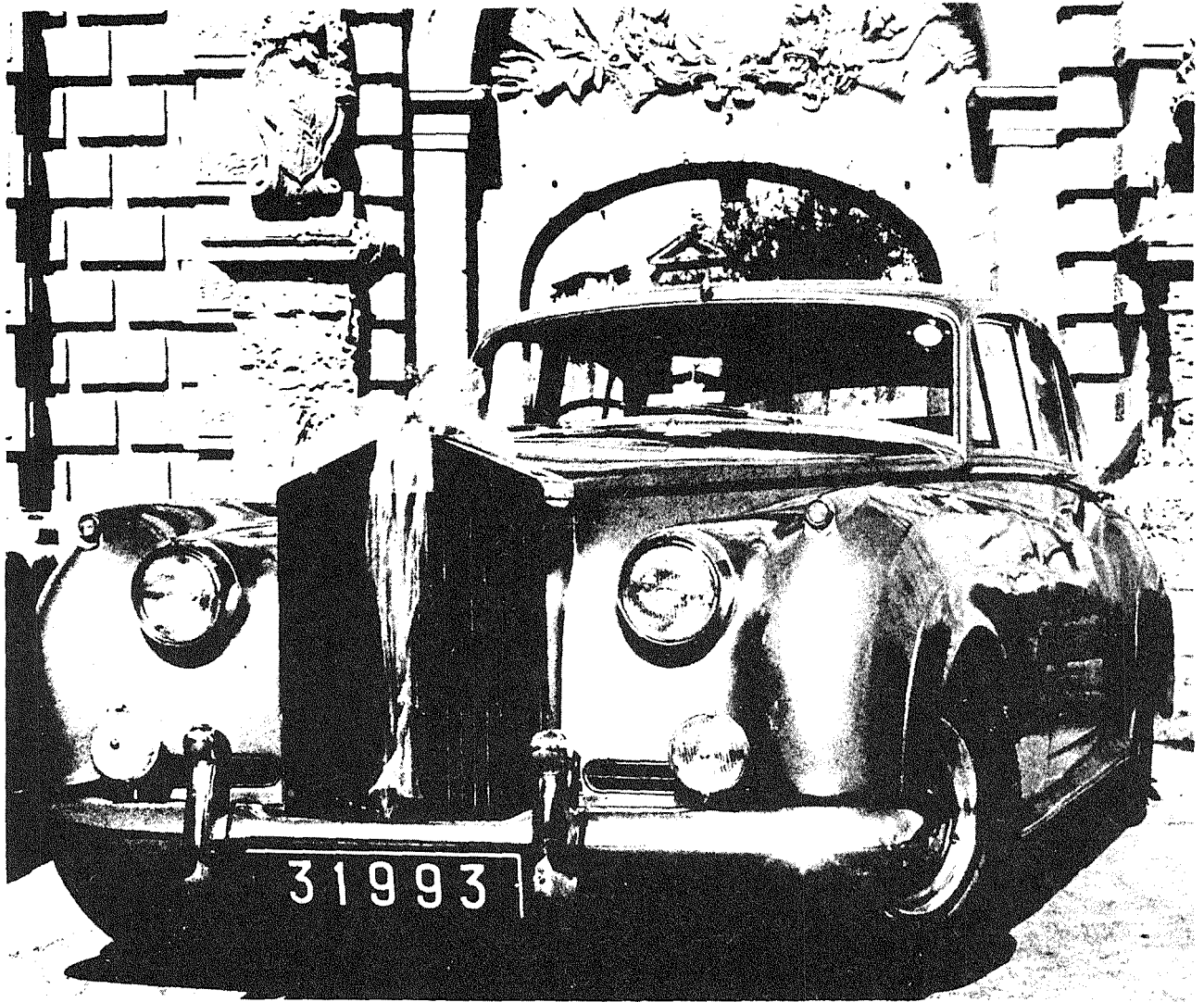
Jidher car minn dawn iz-zewg kazijiet, jigifieri ta' l-Ispettur G. Pace u dan tal-Kuntistabbli Laferla, li xi nies kriminali għazlu

l-mezzi ta' bezziegħa biex jidde-moralizzaw lill-Pulizija. L-iskantament tagħna huwa mhux biss għax tpoggew dawn il-bombi wara l-bibien tal-Pulizija, izda għax propju tpoggew lil nies li huma magħrufa għall-karattru tagħhom b'mod speċjali għal mod kif dejjem lesti biex jghinu lill-pubbliku.

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Drogi Ohra Perikoluzi

L-Iskop ta' dawn l-artikoli huwa wiehed — li nnessel biza genwin mill-abbuz tad-drogi. Inkunu verament boloh jekk bl-akbar konvinzjoni ma niddeciedux li qatt ma niehdu drogi jekk mhux fuq parir tat-tabib kuranti. U biex nipperswadu rwiehna minn din il-verita, ser nghidilkom storja ta' wahda mid-drogi perikoluzi li qeghdin jigu abbuzati proprju fil-granet taghna f'pajjizi ferm aktar sinjuri minnha.

L-Istorja tal-PCP jew Phencyclidine

Madwar is-sena 1950 bdew jesperimentaw b'din id-droga ghax hasbu li tista tintuza bhala anestetiku u f'certu mard mentali. Fl-1960 id-ditta Parke Davis & Co., harget prodott jismu **Sernyl** li kien reklamta bhala droga meraviljuza kontra l-ugigh. Minhabba l-effetti hziena tad-droga l-istess ditta irtiratu u ma baqax jintuza ghall-bnedmin, izda biss fl-annimali; u fl-1978 gie irtirat. L-uzu illelitu ta' din id-droga beda fl-1967 f'San Francisco u xtered taht l-isem ta' *Peace, Angel, Dust, Monkey Tranquilizers, Embalming Fluid, Fuel, Hog*. It-trab huwa maghruf l-aktar bl-ismijiet ta' *Angel Dust u Hog*. Din id-droga tista tintagħmel facilment minn certa kimika anke f'laboratorji privati zghar.

Din id-droga tista tittiehed taht forma ta' pilloli imma anke b'tipjip billi tithallat ma hxejjex komuni, tabakk u anke l-haxixa. Il-pilloli jkun fihom dwar 5 milligrammi tad-droga u jistghu jkunu bojod, roza, homor, kannella, orange, blu, hodur u ttikkjati b'diversi kuluri. Drogi ohra nstabu li kienu mhalltin ma ftit PCP.

Fuq studji li saru fl-Amerika u l-Canada, sar maghruf li f'dawn l-ahhar ghaxar snin id-PCP huwa wahda mill-aktar drogi abbuzati u mxerrda illelitament fit-toroq. Bizzejjed insemmu li f'erba centri ta' kura f'New York, il-persentagg ta' zghazagh li gew ittrattati minhabba l-PCP kien ta' 50, 50, 44, u 32 fil-mija tal-kazi kollha.

Fil-Canada, fl-Addiction Research Foundation ta' Ontario, bejn 1971-1976 il-PCP kien res-

ponsabbli ghal 22 fil-mija tad-drogi maqbuda fit-toroq għall-uzu illelitu.

L-Effetti tal-PCP

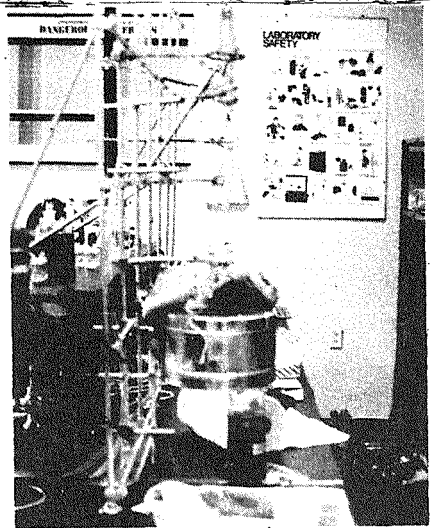
Meta jittiehed bhala pillola jew tipjip, l-effetti jibdeu wara kwarta u jistghu jdumu għal hafna sigħat jew granet. Wara kwarta li jittiehdu l-individwu jsib diffikulta jimxi u jtkellem, jithawwad u ma jkunx kapaci joqghod attent. Effetti ohra li jdumu għal mhux anqas minn 6 sigħat jinkludu: sturdament, ma jarax car imma bhala dahna u deformat; allucinazzjonijiet, delirju, depressjoni, ihossu ser imut, irid jigģieled, jiskanta, jorqod jew jintilef minn sensieh, dardir, regettar, nuqqas ta' aptit u ugieh ta' zaqq. Sintendi, minn jiehu din id-droga jkollu perikolu kbir li jkorri jekk isuq xi vettura, jew li jaq' minn xi għoli, jew jigi milqut minn xi vettura. F'certi kazi tant jithawdu li jsiru vjolenti u jittiehdu l-isptar mill-istess qraba u genituri ghax ma jkunx kapaci jikkontrollawhom. F'din il-vjolenza u konfuzjoni hija ta' importanza il-hars fil-vojt bhal meta wiehed ikun qed johlom.

Il-persjoni tista toghla u l-polz ihabbat mghaggel waqt li jxoqq gharaq qawwi. Jekk id-doza tkun xi ftit akbar, jew il-pazjent ikun suggestt aktar minn ohrajn, jista juri sinjali ta' mard serju mentali. Bejn is-snin 1974-77 f'Washington mhux anqas minn 33 fil-mija tal-kazi fl-isptarijiet mentali kienu dovuti għal din id-droga perikoluza. Il-genn dovut għal PCP f'pazjenti ammessi fl-isptarijiet ta' Washington kien għaddi l-kazi dovuti għall-genn mill-marda mentali komuni tal-**Schizophrenia** u tal-**Alcoholismu**.

L-akbar numru kien ta' rgiel bejn is-17 u 25 sena u l-genituri ta' dawn iz-zghazagh osservaw fihom, qabel ma gie deciz li jehduhom fl-isptar għall-kura dawn is-sintomi u sinjali:-

1. Hafna granet ta' konfuzjoni.
2. Idejat ta' persekuzzjoni.
3. Nuqqas ta' iqaq minhabba tensjoni u allucinazzjonijiet u biza li xi hadd qed jippersegwithom.

Wara xi 5 tiegħem ta' kura l-pazjenti jghaddu minn dan il-perjodu ta' konfuzjoni u għalkemm ma jkollhomx kiet u ma jibqgħux vjolenti, jibdeu jikkoperaw. Wara xi 10 tiegħem jibdeu jirpiljaw, izda jkollhom xejra li jinsew l-ewwel granet tal-marda ricenti tagħhom.

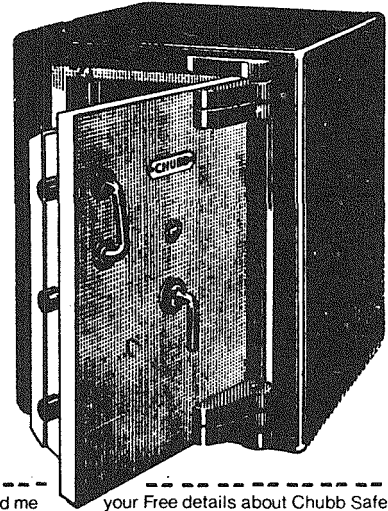
Hafna jirnexxihom ifiequ, izda xi whud jibqgħu bix-xejra li juru nuqqas serju ta' stabilità mentali.

Cohen jirraporta li meta l-PCP gie abbuzat u ripetut wasal biex nissel hsara organika fil-mohh li tikkaguna nuqqas serju ta' memorja, xi ftit tal-konfuzjoni u xi difetti fil-vista u fil-kliem.

Il-PCP huwa droga perikoluza hafna ghax jista jikkaguna mard mentali li ma jingharafx mill-marda mentali tal-*schizophrenia*. Għalkemm din il-marda serja mentali generalment kienet dovuta wara dozi ripetuti tal-PCP gie kagunat ukoll f'xi kazi anke wara doza wahda ta' din id-droga perikoluza.

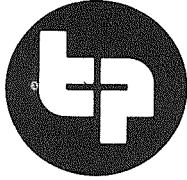
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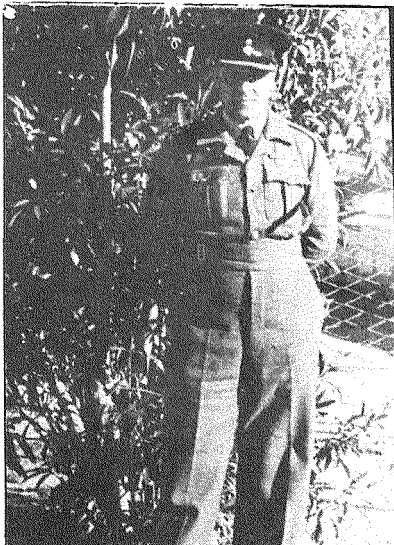

Din il-gakketta kellha wkoll il-bwiet isfel u llum ghadha bl-istess ghamla u kull ma kien hemm huwa tibdil fil-materjal tal-gakketta u qalziet, u llum il-qmis hija ta' kulur celest.

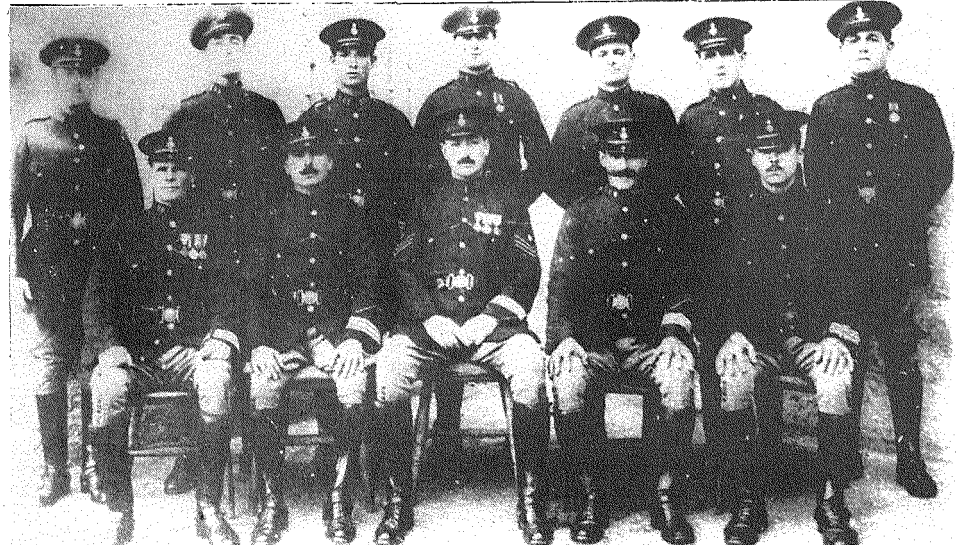
Ta' min isemmi wkoll li minn Jannar tal-1923 il-fizzjali bdew jilbsu s-Sam Browne. Dan fil-bidu kien jintlibes f'certi okkazonijiet bhal meta kienu jkunu xoghol il-Belt, il-Hamrun, Tas-Sliema u l-Kottonera; meta kienu jattendu l-Qorti; meta kienu jattendu ghal xi nkjesta tas-servizzi Inglizi jew meta kienu jidhru quddiem il-Kmandant ta' dawn is-servizzi (Navy, Army u Air Force). Mas-Sam Browne titwahhal ix-xabla u llum din narawha f'xi parata, izda fl-imghoddi ix-xabla kienet titwahhal mas-Sam Browne meta l-fizzjali kienu jattendu l-Qorti Kriminali; meta kienu jidhru quddiem il-Kummissarju tal-Pulizija u meta kienu jattendu ghal xi Court Martial tas-servizzi Inglizi li semmejna.

Parti ohra mill-uniformi tal-fizzjali hija l-'lanyard' li bdiet tintlibes fl-1938. F'dan iz-zmien il-fizzjali kienu jilbsu lanyard bajda li illum tintlibes mill-membri tal-kavallerija tal-Pulizija. Maz-zmien bdiet tintlibes lanyard kahla u llum, ma nafx ghala, dahlet il-lanyard sewda.

Bhala l-ahhar uniformi tax-xitwa tal-fizzjali kien hemm il-Battle Dress li kif jixhed isimha bdiet tintlibes fit-tieni gwerra dinjija u baqghet tintlibes anke wara li spiccat din il-gwerra. Il-Battle Dress tal-fizzjali kienet ta' lewn kannella car u l-gakketta kienet sal-qadd u bl-ghonq miftuh. Taht il-gakketta kienet tintlibes qmis ta' kwazi l-istess kulur tal-gakketta u ingravata sewda. Ta' min isemmi li mal-Battle dress ma kienx jitlibes is-Sam Browne, izda kienet titlibes lanyard kahla.

Nghaddu ghal uniformi ohra tax-xitwa tal-imghoddi li kien il-Great Coat. Dan kien coat ta' materjal ohxon u ta' kulur ikhal skur u kien beda jintlibes f'Malta fl-ghoxrinijiet. Jinghad li dan ma baqghax jintlibes peress li kien isahhan hafna. Coat simili kien jintlibes mill-Pulizija Ingliza. Ma' dan il-coat kien jintlibes l-elm

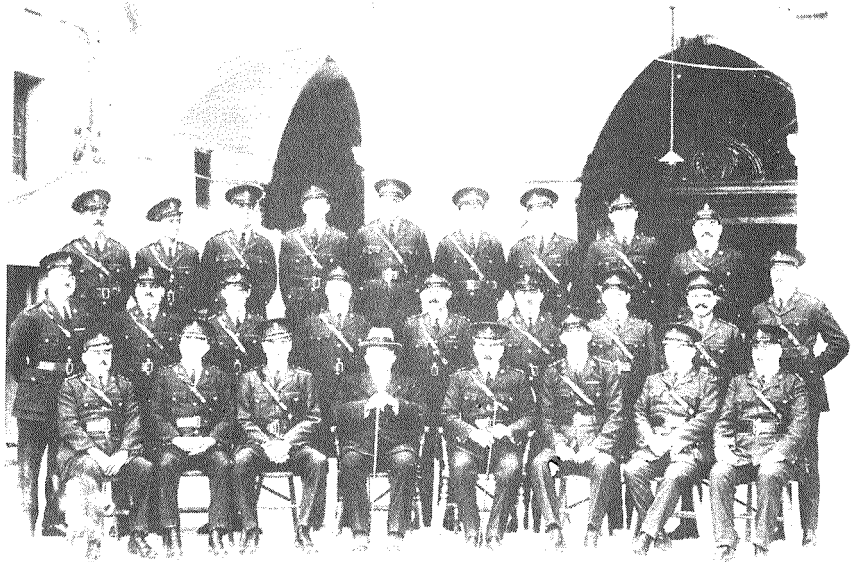
iswed, ukoll bhal dak Ingliz, il-leggings u ingwanti bojod u c-cinturin. Kien hemm zmenijiet meta dan il-coat kien jintlibes fuq id-diskrezzjoni tas-Suprintendent.

Nigu ghall-ahhar uniformi tax-xitwa li hija dik milbusa llum, jigifieri ta' qalziet u gakketta ta' kulur ikhal skur bi qmis celesti. Din l-uniformi bl-ghonq miftugh intlibset l-ewwel darba mill-pulizija fit-3 ta' Frar 1958. Sal-lum din l-uniformi ma kellha l-ebda tibdil fl-ghamla, izda f'Novembru 1967 kien hemm tibdil fil-materjal u ma baqghax jintlibes is-serge.

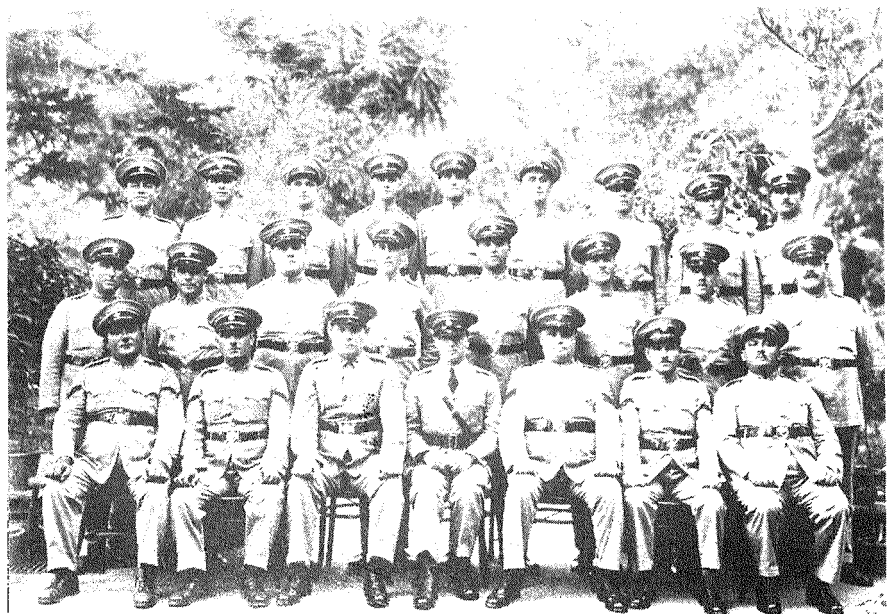
Uniformijiet tas-Sajf

The Protection of Persons and Installations at Risk: The German Way _____ by J. Blum

PREFATORY NOTE

SOME readers may wonder why they should be offered an article on police measures against terrorist violence, seeing that this contagion has not reached the Maltese Islands so far. The author, however, has had two considerations in mind in adapting it for the professional reader in Malta.

One is simply this: police everywhere ought to be forearmed even against such contingencies as may appear remote. When they, perhaps surprisingly, come to pass, it is too late to make a start with laying plans. An example easily comes to mind.

In the early fifties quite a few German police force had neglected their Major Incident procedures, as "everyone knew" that there would be no war in the foreseeable future and that railway accidents etc. would be capably dealt with by the Fire Services and the Red Cross. Then — literally out of a clear sky — a lesson was resoundingly administered. On a Saturday morning, during the shopping rush hour, a large aircraft was observed to be losing height over the Shopping Centre of Munich. With about a minute's warning it crashed amongst the shoppers and strollers. Although the Munich Fire Brigade did highly efficient and gallant work, it was in large measure due to police action according to plan that even greater loss to life, health, property and human happiness was averted. The Munich police had kept their Major Incident procedures up to the mark, though few people then believed they would ever be needed. And what of the civilian volunteers that had been counted on? The first of them arrived, through no fault of theirs, as the last ambulances, loaded by police and firemen, left for the pre-alerted hospitals.

The other consideration in the present writer's mind was based on a desire to stimulate reflection with a view to an exchange of ideas through acquainting the

reader with the answers that have been given in another European country to some questions thoughtful policemen are apt to pose.

Mention has already been made of the fact that this study has been adapted, albeit with a light hand, for the Maltese reader. In the first place some detail has been removed that would be of no interest in Malta. This refers principally to the Railway Police. Where Maltese nomenclature differs from that in use elsewhere, Maltese expressions and technical terms have been substituted. Thus, e.g., "Information Room" has given place to "Control Room". On the other hand no deliberate attempt has been made to point out similarities between Maltese and German institutions.

DURING the last ten years or so the protection of persons and installations against the risks inherent in terrorist violence has been making increasing demands on police efforts and manpower in the Federal Republic of Germany(1). Analogous situations obtain, of course, elsewhere, and for this reason it may be profitable to attempt a concise statement of the situation and some steps taken to meet it(2). Along with this it could be worth while to consider a few of the consequences flowing from the measures adopted.

Looking at terrorism through police statistics, one is at once struck by the fact that many more people lose their lives through road accidents than at the hands of terrorists. Likewise, the material damage caused by the terrorist is infinitesimal compared with that brought about by the larcenist or the dangerous driver. Yet there are the best of reasons for giving the fight against terrorism priority in men, means and money allotted for public security. The terrorism we know today has political motives, and these are based on a desire to subvert society and to remake the state in such a manner as to leave no place for the freedom of individual man.

Let the reader himself draw his comparison between the *Einsatzhundertschaft* in Germany and the Mobile Squad in Malta.

It is customary to end such a note with thanks to those who have been of help to the author in assembling and considering his raw material. This, however, would hardly be very sensible in the present case, since these gentlemen are extremely unlikely to be known to the readers of *Il-Pulizija*. Instead the present writer will express his gratitude to PC Attard, the Secretary of the Malta Police Association, who has introduced him to the journal in which the following article is to appear.

Were terrorism successful in initiating a movement toward that goal, an immediate sideeffect would be to interfere with the democratic legitimation of the state, thus weakening the stance of its defenders. Moreover, as experience in Germany has demonstrated, terrorist activities tend to engender in the politically and morally unstable an inclination to try conclusions with the police.

In the development of terrorist activity within Germany an escalation can be observed that presumably has not yet come to its end. To begin with there was the so-called "violence against chatels". This had the double aim of depriving the state of vital parts of its machinery (e.g. through attacks on court and police buildings by means of explosives and incendiary devices) and of tying down police on protective duty with a view to depriving them of their mobility. At a somewhat later stage appeared an intention on the part of the terrorists to aim their activities so as to produce fear and despondency amongst the general population. In the present phase this aim is being principally furthered by the murder of personalities prominent in public life. As a concomit-

ant to this, the taking of hostages is being practised with a view to obtaining the release of terrorist prisoners. Propagandist activities by the terrorists and their supporters do not require to be gone into here, since they have little bearing on the problem of affording protection against terrorist violence.

Under these circumstances priority has had to be given to the protection of persons and installations at risk because of terrorism. This applied all the more as experience went to show that any loopholes left were soon exploited by the terrorists. The number of police engaged in these duties is variable, but an informed guess is that at least 10 per cent of the entire regular police strength (Uniform Branch and CID) are employed on them. This has, of course, caused personnel shortages in other fields of police activity. There have been times, for example, when 25 per cent of the uniform strength of the police of a state(3) were deployed on protective and anti-terrorist activities.

Although the aims of protective duties have only gradually come to be defined, it would be appropriate to state them as follows:

- continual reconnaissance regarding the persons and installations(4) to be protected.
- presence in the vicinity of the persons and installations to be protected with a view to contacting and informing those at risk, the members of their families, their neighbours etc.
- planning, preparing and executing protective measures, including, where requisite, their being rendered obvious to any potential attacker.
- a "trip wire function" with the object of recognising incipient terrorist activity in due time so as to enable counter-measures to be set in train, if necessary, after having alerted reinforcements.
- collecting, collating and applying the experience gained.

He who attempts to protect everything ends up by protecting nothing. Hence a careful selection of the objects of protective measures is imperative. Previously Police Service Regulations had contained guidelines on the principles to be applied in making such selections. This, however, is no longer the case, and this change is

no doubt to be welcomed in the interests of operational flexibility.

The making of such choices together with the grading of risks and of protective measures (of which more will be said later) is in Germany a matter of the Ministries of the Interior of the several states on the suggestion of police bodies. In coming to their decisions Ministers also have the help of the federal and state Security Services.

Risks and measures of protection in terrorism-related policing can be, and in point of fact are, standardised, as situations tend to repeat themselves in essentials. This enables a great deal of verbiage in operation orders and radio communication to be dispensed with and allows such matters to be easily treated within the framework of training programmes. It goes, however, without saying, that at times the temptation to try and follow a pattern rather than shape one must be resisted.

The gradings used in respect of risks and protective measures need not be reproduced here in their entirety, but giving one or two examples of them may illustrate what is meant. Risks, e.g., are graded thus:

Risk Grade 1 Subject considerably imperilled; attack likely.

Risk Grade 2 Subject imperilled; possibility of attack not to be excluded.

Risk Grade 3 Peril to subject not to be excluded.

Similarly there is a grading of protective measures (from 1 to 6).

Security gradings (*Sicherheitsstufe*), utilised on the occasion of state visits and like events, follow a different pattern that takes account of the likelihood of potential disturbances of public order through a mass concentration of interested spectators with no criminal intent. In order to prevent any confusion between risk gradings and security gradings, the former as well as protective measures are denoted by Arabic numerals, while security gradings are expressed in Roman numerals.

The proof of the pudding is in the eating: terrorist successes in Germany are on the decrease, both numerically and in their effect on public life(5). This may well go to show that the system evolved has its points. Apart from

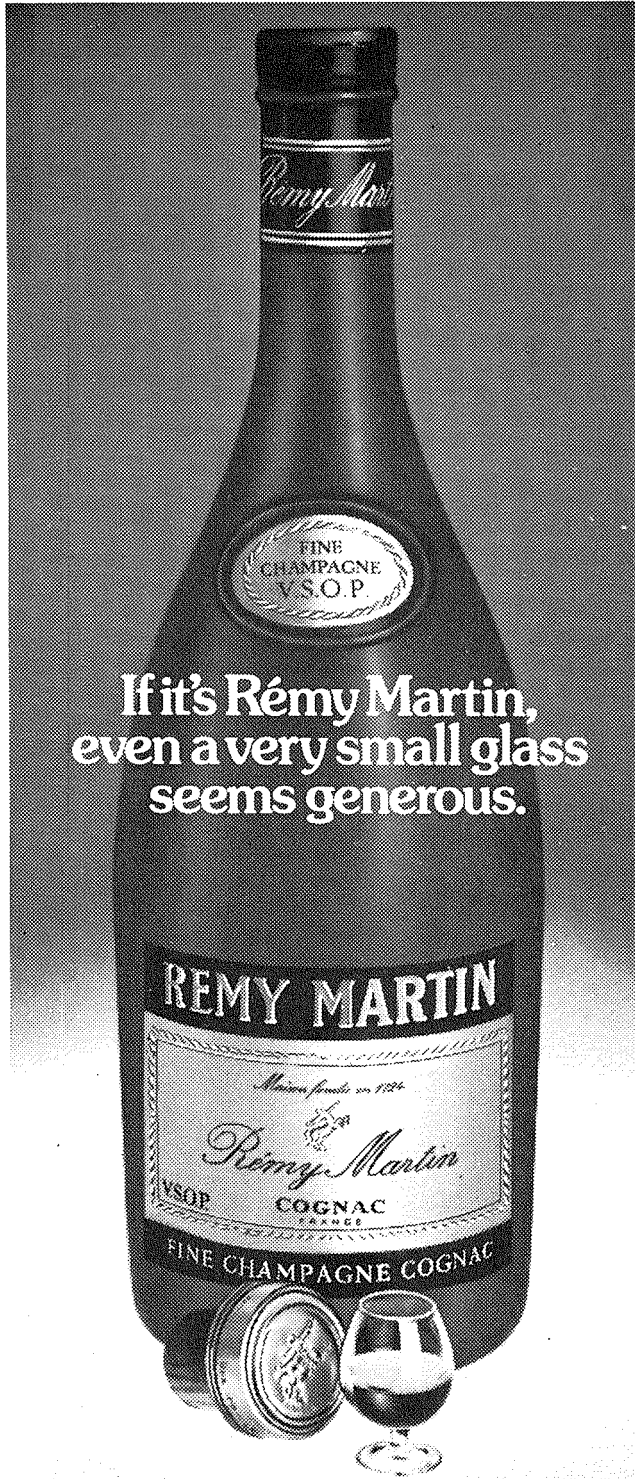
the high—but apparently unavoidable—cost of the measures taken in manpower and money, there is, however, another difficulty it would be unwise to lose sight of.

If the police were able to induce persons at risk to conduct themselves in a manner calculated to diminish the chances of murderous attack on them, this would make their protection a much easier task. Yet it might set in train profound changes in interpersonal relationships that would be apt to make the lives of those protected and others less worth living. This can be illustrated by a fairly recent happening. On information being received that a very senior officer in the Federal Ministry of Justice was in immediate peril from terrorists, he was put in Risk Grade 1, and a senior police officer at once went to see him so as to inform him and to concert measures for his protection. In the course of the ensuing conversation the police officer was at pains to point out that the danger of attack would be greatly increased if the Ministry of Justice officer continued to deliver his customary lectures at a university. Half jokingly, reference was made to the armoured glass cabin, famous from the trial of the mass murderer, Eichmann, in Jerusalem, that would have been imported so as to afford a modicum of protection to one who unfailingly put in an appearance at a time and in a place known in advance and well publicised. After very brief consideration he decided to abide by his academic activities. It was obvious that he preferred the unhampered contact with the undergraduates to enhanced protection with its attendant demonstration of vulnerability. It would perhaps not be very easy to find fault with this attitude of a public servant. Indeed, the fabric of society cannot be meaningfully protected by means apt to damage it.

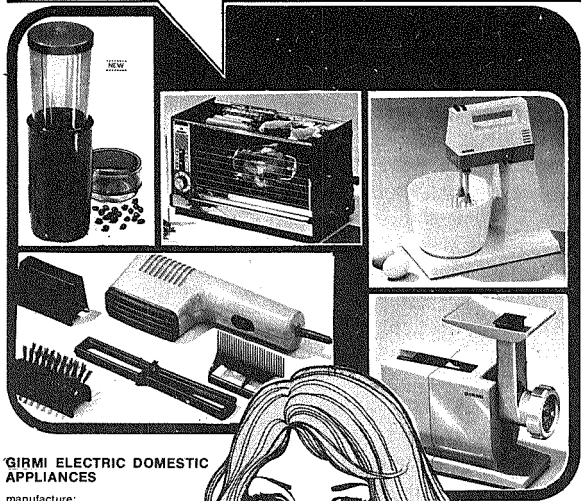

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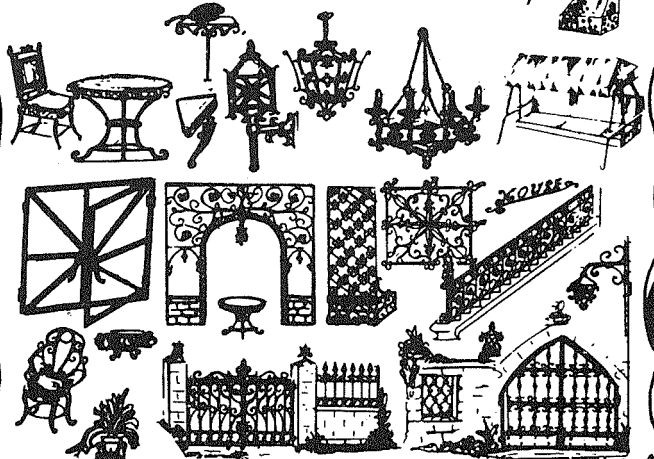
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GOALS & OBJECTIVES OF PRISON DEPT.

THE principal aim of the Prisons Department is protection of the public from crime.

There are three different ways in which the Prisons Department may do this. The first is deterrence of the potential criminal through fear of sentences carried out by Prisons. The second is physical separation of the law-breaker from the public at large. The third is rehabilitation of the persons under sentence so as to decrease the chance of further criminal acts.

Other goals, such as punishment or vengeance, may satisfy some, but are not a proper part of our operational endeavour. They offer no public protection.

With regard to these three ways in which the department may help to reduce crime, the following principles are held to apply.

Deterrance

While it has truly been said that more people are law-abiding from respect for the law than from fear of it, if there were no prisons or jails, some individuals would do unlimited harm in the community.

Therefore, this function of penal institutions cannot be ignored, but it should not be overestimated. Even people who have been in prison and know they can be caught are sometimes not deterred. Few persons committing crimes expect to be caught; others lack self-control and do not consider their future. Further there is no evidence that long sentences deter more than short ones. Therefore, to attempt to control crime by the effect of ever longer prison terms won't succeed, as both logic and history prove. Deterrence can probably be made more powerful only by increasing the certainty of arrest, a police function.

Separation of the Lawbreaker From the Public

Prisons are generally effective in achieving this aim. We do less well than we should, however, in determining which offenders are dangerous and require continued

isolation from society and which do not.

Isolation affords relatively sure short-term protection to society.

Such protection must be balanced against the negative effects of long terms on prisoners, and against the cost of long terms. Almost all prisoners will get out eventually, and the sort of person a man has become may carry more weight for protecting Society than the time of his release.

Some of the negative features of prison must remain as necessary evils, but conditions which can be made more normal should be. The fact that prisoners were so completely isolated in the past permitted and encouraged practices which are now being questioned and changed. Finally, it is important that the system provide a good range of isolation and security and that people be classified properly as to their security needs. Human beings in our society should be subjected to no more restrictive restraint than necessary.

Rehabilitation

While we tend to think of rehabilitation as coming only from particular programmes such as schools or counselling, this is not true. It is the total prison and community experience which makes its impact. What happens to a man in the cell block, for example, may do more to change him for better or worse than what happens to him in the classroom or counselor's office. It is how a person is treated in general which matter most.

It is also a mistake to think that 'rehabilitation' is something that can either be given to or forced upon anyone. People can really change only themselves; they are responsible for their own acts and their own futures. Our job is to provide as much opportunity as we can for change to occur. But it is the individual who will himself make or fail to make the change, and we must recognize and even insist on his bearing and responsibility. There is a strong tendency for institutions to make people dependent, to create mindless conformity, and to neither require nor allow the learning of

anything important. We must work against this tendency, since it takes away the responsibility which is the basic for true change. In general, rehabilitative goals will be better met in the community than in prison, but this fact still hasn't been put fully into practice.

Conditions and Limits

The public not only asks that we meet our basic goal but insists that we do so humanely, economically and justly.

Treating people humanely is not merely or even mainly a matter of kindness. It is a matter of recognising individual human worth and in a prison setting this requires creating conditions of safety and security. The greatest danger and threat to individual well being in an institution has proved to come from a minority of prisoners who are predatory or violent. This must be controlled on humane grounds so that positive programmes can have an effect, which they cannot have if fear and disorders prevail.

But institutional security cannot be imposed by controls and punishments alone. When the attempt has been made to do that, it has failed. There is no end to the escalation that results from increasing pressures, and finally, everyone loses. History has taught that lesson often; but perhaps because of natural tendency to "fight fire with fire" or because it is a difficult and constantly wearing task to work through problems positively and individually, rather than by blanket repressions, it is a lesson which is hard to convey and one to which we must expect to give continued dedication and effect.

Economy is not simply a matter of cutting expenditures. Some savings, such as those from operating very large prisons, have great social cost and are poor bargains. True economy comes from the results. Therefore, we must better evaluate what we do and be prepared to depart from traditions. We know what we are spending, but not much about what we are buying, and we must

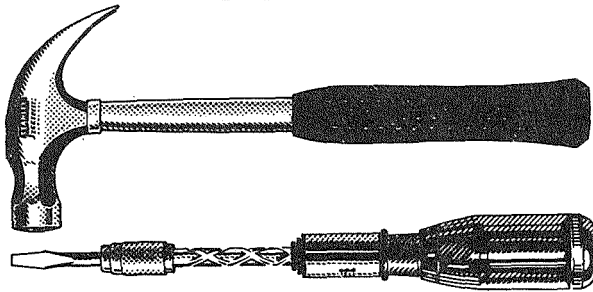
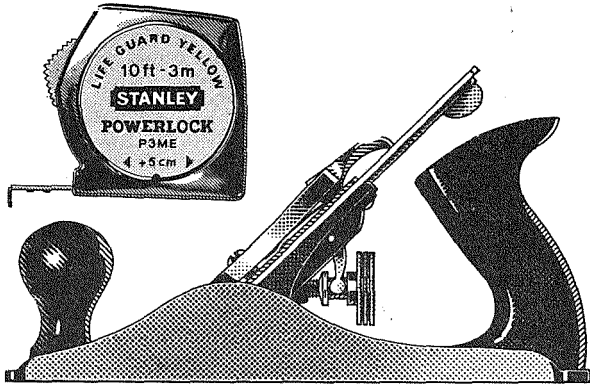

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POLICE AND THE PUBLIC PART 3

Meeting the Public

A policeman's duty is to regulate the conduct of and minister to the needs of people of all works of life. The rich and the poor, the old and the young, the firm and the infirm, the learned and the illiterate are equally entitled to the protection of the law. The public contacts of policemen are principally with persons who, at the time, are under stress of excitement. They are citizens who, in trouble or difficulty, turn to the policeman for assistance and protection. Their problems are most important to them, though they may seem insignificant to the policeman who is accustomed to deal daily with sordid and distressing situations. It is imperative that matters of such vital personal importance be approached by understanding, compassion, and magnanimity.

Personal Conduct

The relationship between individuals are affected by the impact of their personalities one upon the other. Every characteristic in the personality of one person becomes an important factor in the reaction or behaviour of the other. A policeman may develop a favourable personality if he recognises and cultivates the characteristics or traits that are known to produce favourable reactions in others and suppresses the ones that are responsible for unfavourable reactions. The development of personality, however, involves a sincere acceptance of the fact that, in order to make the proper adjustments and corrections, the policeman must institute disciplinary checks. It is imperative that he develop good habits and eliminate bad habits.

Importance of Good Habits

Habits of politeness are formed in the everyday life of the policeman. These habits may stem from the practice of courtesy in the home as evoked by parental discipline. But among fellow workers courtesy is an official subject; it is compelled by disciplinary measures provided for in the regulations of the organisation. The finest example of official courtesy

is found in military organisations where exacting codes of official conduct are enforced by disciplinary authority.

Before policemen can fully appreciate the rights and privileges of citizens, they must first have learned to respect the rights and privileges of their comrades. They will not recognise the importance of their fellow citizens until they have formed the habit of being considerate of their colleagues. If policemen cannot subscribe to the rules of propriety in the intimate relationships with their comrades, then they have not captured the spirit of amenity and cannot sincerely practice courtesy in the less intimate relationships with the public.

Is Courtesy a Sign of Weakness?

Numerous contacts with antisocial persons are likely to cause policemen to assume a veneer of hardness. They often entertain an erroneous belief that courteous treatment of law violators is an indication of weakness, of cringing, or of servility. They will say that criminals are not entitled to the treatment accorded gentlemen. Property in the treatment of law breakers in no way indicates weakness. Policemen may be firm and exacting in the enforcement of the law; they may be strict and relentless in their relationships with the offenders that come under their control yet remain helpful and gentlemanly in their bearing. The fact that a criminal, by reason of his depravity or because of his antisocial habits, has not earned the respect of his fellow man has no bearing upon the conduct of the policeman with whom he is brought into contact. When officers of the law resort to ungentlemanly treatment of criminals, they do not alter the status of the criminals in the least. They only lower their own social status to the same level occupied by criminals.

Acts of courtesy are disciplinary reminders of the importance of helpful conduct and are important measures in the development of personality. Courtesy is the essence of good manners. It is a manifestation of sportsmanship, and an exposition of gentility and culture. The rules of etiquette

that prescribe the common acts of courtesy were established by years of custom and usage, and their performance is a public acknowledgement of understanding and of a sincere acceptance of the rules of gentlemanly demeanor. Strict adherence to the standards of proper behaviour curbs undesirable characteristics, thus breaking up and destroying bad habits; at the same time, it strengthens the influence of the favourable characteristics of personality.

Use of Authority

Citizens look upon policemen as representatives of the authority of law. It is obvious therefore that the influence of policemen over citizens is increased by reason of the authority they represent. People under stress or under the influence of excitement are more susceptible to the influence of external stimuli than they would be under normal circumstances. They are likely to be more readily influenced by the actions of those with whom they come into contact. Policemen must be very careful that the influence of their authority does not become oppressive in their relationship with the public, particularly in situations of stress and excitement.

Being courteous involves much more than friendliness. To appreciate and to sincerely and habitually perform acts of courtesy requires cultivation of appearance, voice, manner, intelligence, humour, temperament, and unselfishness. All of these factors come into the production of a gentleman is not a part-time occupation, neither are there varying gradations of politeness in human relationships. One cannot be a gentleman in public and a cad in private; neither can one be a gentleman for a part of the time or only under certain circumstances or only with certain persons.

Courtesy must spring from the heart; it must originate in a sincere desire to be right, to be respected and honoured. Sincere courtesy requires one to be friendly without becoming familiar, dignified without being aloof; compassionate but firm and earnestly interested without being over-solicitous. Policemen must continually practice courtesy; they must make no exceptions. Disagreeable duties must be performed willingly and unpleasant orders obeyed cheerfully. Flares of temper, sarcasm, and periods of moodiness have no place in the conduct of a good police officer.

Inhoss li kieku bqajna attivi, stajna nkunu wiehed mit-teams promossi fit-tieni divizjoni.

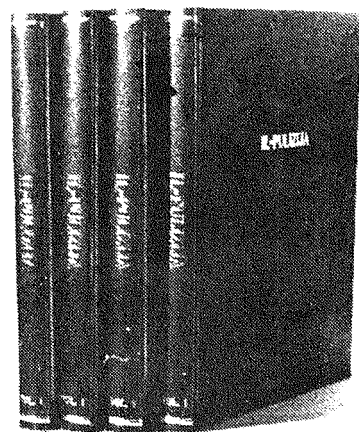
3. Chess u Draughts

Police officers must be exceptionally careful not to say or do anything that might be construed as critical or disparaging of any race, creed, or class of people. They must avoid abruptness in answering queries, and they must particularly refrain from harsh or insolent language whether on duty or off duty.

Departmental rules and regulations cannot anticipate all situations that might arise involving courteous behaviour. Policemen frequently find many occasions where they are compelled to go beyond the limitations of the rule in their determinations of the courteous courses to follow.

3. PHP; PCPy=1-(1-phenyl-cyclohexyl) pyrrolidine.

try to determine that. Until we do we will be prey to the host of simple but disastrous solutions proposed at a distance by various vested interests. We know that the answer to doing a better job will not be simple, and it may be expensive, but we must be able to justify the expense.

Justice and equity are mandatory in all areas of practice. Treating people equitably is not the same as regimentation, which is negative. There are really three related conditions which must exist:

1. Persons must not be discriminated against on any racial or ethnic basis.
2. Actions which affects people's Welfare must be taken on a rational, objective, and non-arbitrary basis.
3. Due process must be given so far as possible in imposing penalties and controls so that people are protected from abuse of power.

For convenience and because of lack of resources, our Prisons have often in the past dealt with people en masse arbitrarily.

The Courts are ruling against such practices, on grounds of justice and human rights. But in our Prisons there is a further reason for change; so long as we deal with people arbitrarily we cannot expect our rehabilitation programmes to work, or people to begin to respect the rights of others, if their own lives and concerns are treated as unimportant and subject to unexplained and arbitrary decisions.

To change these practices, as is now occurring, makes great demands upon all concerned. But the job we are charged with requires it.
