Courses at the Gozo Campus

The second semester of academic year 2022/23, saw the continuation of the courses being offered at the campus, namely the Diploma in Commerce (Yr 2), the Bachelor of Commerce in Business and Enterprise Management and Economics (Yr 1), the Bachelor of Commerce (Yr 2), the Bachelor of Psychology (Hons) (Yr 2), the Bachelor of Arts in Criminology (Hons) (Yr 5) and the Master in Counselling (Yr 2).

The Centre for Liberal Arts and Sciences continued with the offering of another study-unit, entitled, 'The Art of Maltese Bobbin Lace II'. This course was intended to help students explore the Maltese Lace style and technique and improve on it. It consisted of 28 hours of lectures and practical sessions and was attended by a good number of participants, both Gozitans and Maltese.

The University of the Third Age continued with its programme during the second semester with the offering of more courses to the elderly. The courses offered are: 'Xjenza u Religjon' and 'The Psychology of Aging: A practical approach to understanding its process'. The lectures were offered on Friday mornings. As usual, the number of participants for these courses was very good.

Gozo Lace Day

The University Gozo Campus, in collaboration with the International Organisation of Needle and Bobbin Lace (OIDFA) (Malta) and Koperattiva Għawdxija tal-Bizzilla u Artiġjanat, organised the annual event "Gozo Lace Day". This event was organised after a break of three years due to the COVID pandemic. The event was held on Sunday 16th April 2023 at the University Gozo Campus and consisted of a number of exhibitions and demonstrations of Gozo lace and talks on matters related to lace-making. were Professor Philip Von Brockdorff, Rector's Delegate for Gozo and Dr Consiglia Azzopardi.

In his introductory speech Professor Von Brockdorrf welcomed those present and gave a brief description of the courses being offered at the campus including those in lace-making. The courses related to lace-making are being offered by the Centre for Liberal Arts and Sciences of the University of Malta and it is planned that such courses continue to be offered in the future. He also explained how lace-making is considered as one of the unique characteristics of the Gozitan touristic product and how it forms an intrinsic part of the island's traditions.

In her speech Dr Consiglia Azzopardi gave an overview of the works and courses, related to lace-making, offered at the Gozo Campus. She also introduced a lace pattern to the audience and gave a detailed explanation of how it is worked. She thanked the staff at the Gozo Campus for their assistance in the offering of courses and the organisation of similar events.

Numerous lace makers and friends attended the event which also included exhibitions of contemporary lace master-pieces and textile crafts. There were a number of stands mounted by OIDFA (Malta), the Koperattiva Għawdxija tal-Bizzilla u Artiġjanat and by the Centre for Liberal Arts and Sciences students.

WISEflow Exams at the Gozo Campus

During the month of October, a number of exam rooms at the campus were furnished with the necessary technology in order to hold WISEflow exams on campus. Power sockets have been installed at every desk in order to ensure that students would have access to electricity for their laptops during exams. Wi-Fi access points were installed in each room to provide a stable internet connection during the examination process. Moreover, the University of Malta will also be providing a dedicated IT technician to be present throughout all examination sessions. This technician will offer immediate

support to address any technical issues, which may arise during the exams. The first WISEflow on campus exams are scheduled to be held in February 2024.

Restoration and Refurbishing Works

Extensive restoration works on the exterior walls of the campus have been completed. This project, which included the restoration of the stone fabric as well as the numerous wooden apertures, was financed by the Ministry for Gozo.

Internally, a number of lecture rooms and corridors are being upgraded and refurbished. New furniture for lecture rooms will be procured in the coming months, while a new kitchenette will be installed in one of the smaller rooms.

Over the past couple of years, the campus was extended with a completely new wing. Once finished, this wing will include a state-of-theart conference hall on the first floor, a computer laboratory and a number of lecture rooms on the ground floor. It will also incorporate offices and a lift, which will provide adequate access also to the old part of the campus.

All this is in line with plans for the campus to extend its activities beyond programmes and examinations.
