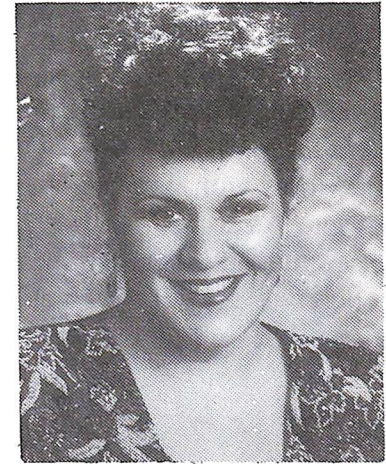

graduated from the Conservatoire di Venezia with full marks in 1983 and carried the honours at the Spoleto festival in the same year. Her debut in *Trovatore* made her the only mezzo soprano to qualify as a finalist in the Maria Callas contest organised by RAI.



Since then she has had a brilliant career which led her to the most prestigious theatres in the world. Amongst her successes we find *Il Barbiere di Siviglia* at the Sferisterio di Macerata and the San Carlo di Napoli, *Adriana Lecouvreur* at Bari and Bologna; *L'occasione fa il Ladro* and *La Gazza Ladra* (CD Sony) by Rossini and *Il Requiem* by Mozart at the Rossini Opera Festival of Pesaro. *Norma* in Canada and Portugal, *Messa* by Donizetti, with Gavazzeni at Milano. She collaborated with Il Teatro alla Scala di Milano in *Fetonte* by Jomelli under the baton of Riccardo Muti: *Nabucco*, in a tournée to Berlin, Tokyo and Carnegie Hall in New York, *Guglielmo Tell* (CD Philips), *Lu Frate 'nnamurato* by Pergolesi (CD EMI), Verdi's *Requiem*, also a tournée to Moscow, St Petersburg and North America and recently; *Don Carlo* at the inauguration of the current season at La Scala; also recorded on video and disc.

She sang Dorabella in *Così Fan Tutte* at the Teatro Fenice of Venezia, Aurelio in *L'assedio di Calais* at the Donizetti Opera Festival in Bergamo and Eboli and in *Don Carlo* at Teatro Regio di Torino. She made her debut at the Maggio Musicale Fiorentino in 1992 and in *La Forza Del Destino*, directed by Zubin Metha. Future engagements include *Les Troyens* by Berlioz in London, with Sir Colin Davis, and *Norma* at the Teatro Fenice in Venezia.

Eddi de Nadai

graduated in pianoforte and harpsichord at the Conservatorio di Venezia and studied *perfezionamento* with the Russian maestro Konstantin Bogino. He has built for himself an excellent reputation as an accompanist, especially in the romantic and modern lieder repertoire, with singers like Erik Werba, Elly Ameling and Rudolph Jansen. As soloist, with orchestra, or as a member of a chamber ensemble, like the Quartetto Cameristico Veneto, he has given concerts all over Europe, besides appearing on Rai, and the Swedish, Rumanian and Jugoslavian radios.
