## *From The Group Scout Leader*

As we reflect on the past three months, it is remarkable to see the variety and richness of activities organized by each section. From outdoor adventures to indoor engagements, all initiatives have been guided by the core Scouting principle of learning by doing.

While our official Scouting year began in September, the highlight came in October when the Group held its first official meeting. This event included Going-Up ceremonies and the much-anticipated launch of "The Victoria Scout Group - Chronicle of Events II - The Following 10 Years (2013-2023)", authored by Mr Carm C. Cachia. Attendees had the opportunity to have their copies signed by Mr Cachia himself.

October was bustling with activities. The sections organized outdoor meetings at "Ġnien ta' Blankas," olive-picking, and participated in the OASI Fun Run, where

we acted as marshals. Additionally, seven Rover Scouts, who completed the Explorer Belt Challenge last summer, gave a presentation of their experiences to the Rover Commissioner, Mr Kenneth Mangion, fulfilling their final requirement for the award.

A standout event in October was the Marquee Lunch weekend camp. This included the Intergenerational Scouting Adventure, where members and their elderly relatives joined in games and camp activities, and the Marquee Lunch fundraiser, which welcomed over 140 guests for a delightful Sunday lunch under canvas. The camp also featured a visit from the Contingent Leader for the 2027 Jamboree, who introduced this exciting upcoming adventure to the Troop.

November began with the Pack hosting a Halloween-themed sleepover at HQ, the Troop holding a joint

meeting with the Xagħra Scout Troop, and the Venture Scouts embarking on a challenging 21km night hike. A number of leaders attended a First Aid Course to ensure we continue to provide safe and high-quality experiences for our members.

The Group also came together for a Mass at HQ to remember departed souls and participated in the Remembrance Day ceremony at Independence Square. These activities reinforced the values of community and reflection.

In December, the Troop organized a hike followed by an astronomy session at Dar Ġużeppa Debono. They also hosted a PLs and APLs training camp at HQ, focusing on teambuilding and leadership skills. The Pack focused on badge work and carried out a good turn by visiting St. Dominic's Home for the Elderly in Victoria. Meanwhile, the Venture Unit engaged in abseiling and hosted an International Night, preparing and sharing food from different cultures. Their good turn involved baking cookies and delivering them on Christmas Eve to essential workers at the hospital and the police station.

## Troop Report

As usual the Troop's weekly meetings were quite varied. They included different activities as well as games.

In October, the Scouts held elections for the roles of Patrol Leaders and Assistant Patrol Leaders. During one meeting, Mr Dave Clements, an honorary member of the Group, addressed the Troop, explaining how he met members of our Group over 50 years ago while he was serving in the Royal Navy.

During another Troop meeting held at Dwejra with Timmy Cutugno, Head of Contingent for the 26<sup>th</sup> World Scout Jamboree, the Scouts learned more about the next Jamboree. Scout Leader David Grech from our Group, who will be acting as Deputy Head of Contingent joined him for this briefing session.

In November, the Victoria Scout Group and Xaghra Scout Group came together for an exciting joint activity in Ghajnsielem Square, organized by SPLs Nina and Gabriele. The event featured a thrilling photo treasure hunt with an added challenge: safeguarding two eggs along the way! While not every egg made it safely to the final checkpoint under Fort Chambray, the activity was a huge success.

This fun and engaging event, planned entirely by the SPLs, was a fantastic opportunity for team-building and friendship as the two Groups connected and collaborated.

A rather special activity took place in December when the Troop hiked from headquarters in Victoria to Dar Ġużeppla Debono in Ghajnsielem for a very interesting astronomy session. The night between the 6<sup>th</sup> and the 7<sup>th</sup> December marked the time of opposition of Jupiter. Opposition is when the Sun, the Earth and Jupiter are exactly aligned so that Jupiter is directly opposite the sun. Since 1962, this opposition came at the closest it had ever been to Earth, making Jupiter the 3<sup>rd</sup> brightest celestial body after the moon and Venus and visible to the naked eye.

From their vantage point, Scouts were able to observe this phenomenon - the planet, other stars and the moon through the telescope when allowed by clouds. The Troop would like to thank Ms Maria Attard from Dar Ġużeppla Debono for inviting and hosting them for this unique experience.

In December Patrol Leaders and Assistant Patrol leaders attended a training course at headquarters. This will help them to hone in on their leadership skills.

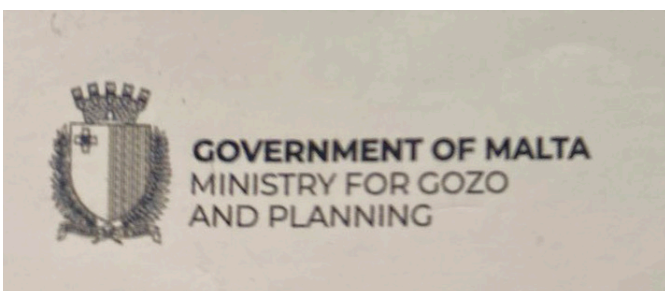
The activity was part of the month-long programme of activities organised by the Ministry for Gozo and Planning. Thank you for your support.

## *Point to Ponder with the Editor Anita Muscat*

The upcoming **World Scout Jamboree** will be held in Gdańsk, Poland, between the 30<sup>th</sup> July and 8<sup>th</sup> August 2027. This will be the 26<sup>th</sup> Jamboree in the history of Scouting.

The Jamboree will be organised by Związek Harcerstwa Polskiego (ZHP), the Polish Scouting and Guiding Association. In 2027, they will also be celebrating the 120<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Scout Movement in Poland.

The World Scout Jamboree is one of the largest outdoor global youth events. Tens of thousands of Scouts from all over the world take part in a camp and participate in activities where they make new friends, learn about the environment and other cultures and develop leadership skills that will last a lifetime. Jamborees are held once every 4 years.

Jamborees provide a unique opportunity for young people to learn from one another, develop leadership skills, and engage in outdoor activities while embracing the Scouting principles of community service, personal growth, and environmental stewardship. Jamboree programmes include educational, recreational, and community service activities. These experiences help Scouts build a strong sense of global citizenship and foster a deeper understanding of diverse cultures, ultimately contributing to a more peaceful and connected world.

Scouts between the ages of 14 and 17 at the time of the event and coming from all 176 member organisations can attend. Scouts who are older than 18 can attend as ISTs, International Service Team. Then there are adult volunteers and Contingent Management Team (CMT) members since thousands of volunteers are involved in the organisation of such a large scale event.

The motto of this Jamboree is “Bravely!” It inspires courage, collaboration, and engagement. It invites all participants, regardless of age, to bravely explore the world around them, to overcome challenges and rejoice in a community connected by their Scouting values. This motto holds particular significance in Poland, especially in Gdańsk, a city renowned for its association with the historic Solidarity Movement.

The Scout Association of Malta has already started

preparing for this international gathering. The Head of the Maltese Contingent and the Assistant Head have already been selected. The former is Timmy Cutugno from the Sliema Group while the latter is our very own Scout Leader David Grech. Online meetings for the contingent teams have already started. Briefing sessions with the Scouts have also taken place. A good number of Scouts have shown interest.

The organisers promise to create and deliver ‘an incredible and transformative experience for the young leaders of tomorrow’.

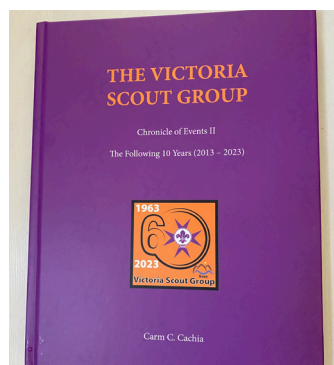
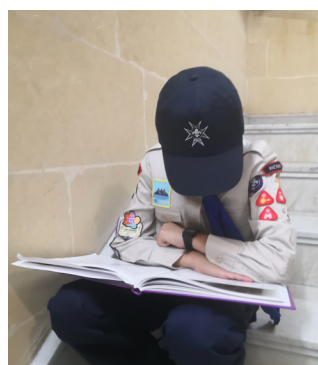

Even though the yield was smaller this year, it was still a beautiful afternoon. There's something so peaceful about working together in nature, knowing we're continuing a tradition that's become part of our Unit's identity. The Marquee Lunch, though, was hands down the most intense activity in October. While setting up the campsite, preparing games, and cooking that beef stew in the cast iron skillet, I've never felt more like a true Scout. The stew alone took some time to prepare, but the end result was worth every minute. Seeing parents, Cubs, and Scouts enjoying what we'd worked so hard to put together was incredibly fulfilling. It reminded me why I love being a Venture.

Knowing that those cookies brought some holiday cheer to people who couldn't be with their families on Christmas Eve was such a powerful reminder of what Scouting is all about. It's about service, kindness, and community.

These three months have been a whirlwind of activity, but more than that, they've shown me how much we can achieve when we work together. I've grown closer to my fellow Ventures, learned new skills, and pushed myself in ways I didn't think I could. If this is what we accomplished in just three months, I can't wait to see what the next year holds for us."

The first hike for this Scouting year took the Pack to Wied il-Mielah, limits of Ghasri. During the hike they used their senses to

- see tracking signs, indigenous and invasive plants and learn how each plays its role, centuries-old rubble walls and discussed their important function, an underground spring, fossils, and finally the magnificent rock formation known as it-Tieqa ta' Wied il-Mielah.
- hear underground water trickling beneath their feet, the chirping of birds and the wind blowing through the trees and canes
- feel, smell and taste some of the plants they passed by
- and learnt lot about all that surrounded them.

During their walk they practised the Leave No Trace principle. They also managed to do a cleanup.

Another outdoor meeting took the Pack to the olive grove at Ta' Blankas in Xewkija. Bagheera Betty who is a licenced wildlife rescuer with Nature Trust's Wildlife Rescue Team, Gozo section, talked about her experiences and rescue missions as well as local wildlife. Volunteers such as Betty have wildlife handling permits given by ERA after special training is received.

During another meeting the Cubs were introduced to the new Cub programme which the Packs will be now adopting. The leaders explained the new make-up - the different areas, the paths and the activities, the Progressive Scheme and the Skills badges which make up this new proposal.

At the end of the discussion, the Cubs discussed what they had heard and chose the area which they will tackle for the coming 2 months.

In October the Cubs took part in the Jamboree-On-The Internet (J.O.T.I.) They chatted and communicated through SKYPE with other Scouts from different countries, amongst which Japan, Taiwan, Indonesia and Poland.

In November, the customary sleepover and Halloween party at headquarters provided an evening and a night of fun, games and camaraderie. Games, food, a screening of the Jungle Book and the unmissable pillow fight made for a truly memorable evening.
