CLUBS

The Clubs are intended to help students to socialise, develop their skills in a particular sport, introduce them to new sporting activities or interests, and also enhance their knowledge and skill in non-academic fields. In line with this aim, the College has set up the following Clubs: President's Award, Photography, Dancing, Flower Arranging and a Literary Society and Girls in the City. There is also a Sports Club which includes a number of disciplines: Football, Cycling, Volleyball, Basketball, Handball, Tennis, Fitness, Netball, Hockey, Chess and Judo.

STUDENT EXCHANGES

The student exchanges, co-ordinated by the Eurocentre are organised with a cultural and educational purpose, where destinations vary from one year to another. These short visits abroad are believed to be a great asset for our students' development, in helping them widen their personal and cultural horizons and establish interpersonal relations through the experience of living with a family overseas, whilst the guest students stay with Maltese families. Such exchange projects engage students from different study areas and backgrounds, including drama, music, languages and sciences.

THE JUNIOR COLLEGE ORCHESTRA

The College Orchestra composed of aspiring young musicians forms an integral part of the cultural agenda of the Junior College throughout the year. Under the direction of Mro. Manoel Pirotta, the Orchestra performs a vast repertoire comprised of popular classics of instrumental and vocal music. The past academic year has been successful with concerts performed in prestigious venues in Germany, Italy and France as well as in various towns and villages locally.

SOCIAL AND CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

These include concerts of classical music, i.e. singing, musical recitals and ballet, as well as choral and orchestral performances, particularly the Students' Soiree. Students are encouraged to put up the shows themselves. This includes choreography, composing musical scores, writing short plays and sketches, as well as getting involved in backstage activities, i.e. painting of scenery, make-up, hairdressing, preparing costumes for the cast and handling light and sound effects.

The College aims at creating a stimulating and inviting atmosphere to enable students to strike a balance between study and leisure.
