

Naudi

Naudi Dr Francesco, LL.D. - One of Hon. Judges - (1793-1842)

Born in 1793, during the rule of the Dukes; appointed Judge on January 2, 1841;

died suddenly of apoplexy in his sleep during the night of 25/26 October 1842:

"a good citizen, a splendid magistrate, and a loving father, he deceased the loss of his family and the esteem of all: public confidence in him was universal" (Prestafogio's Mother).

He was buried in the family vault in the parish church of Ascija and his funeral was attended by the Chief Secretary, Hon. Judges and other high government officials and a large number of his friends.

Naudi, Sir Salvatore, Kt., C.M.G., LL.D. - One of Hon. Judges - (1820-1900)

Born in July 1820, son of Judge Dr. Francesco Naudi and Maria Teresa nee Cachia, in Casal Ascija; he was aged 22 when his father died suddenly in his sleep, in 1842; graduated in law in 1843 at the Malta University; had an exceptionally distinguished career in the local Bar where he was one of the most eminent advocates of his times; in 1854 he was elected member to the Council of Government and on July 1, 1859 he was appointed Judge; Knight Bachelor in 1878 and C.M.G. in 1888; on September 30, 1895 he retired on pension at his own request. Died aged 80 years at his residence in Casal Ascija No. 139 Dta. S. Maria at 2.30 am on Sunday, the 15th July 1900.

Buried at the Addolorato Cemetery. Survived by his wife Lady Elizabeth Naudi nee Gatt.

Naudi, Dr Agostino, LL.D. - One of Hon. Judges - (? - 1895)

A leading barrister for many years; entered politics and was elected member of the Council of Government in 1880 and subsequent elections; appointed acting Judge on April 8, 1895, appt. one of Hon. Judges on May 10, 1895. Died suddenly while on holiday in Naples on the night of Monday, 29th July 1895 and was buried in Naples.

"He had sterling qualities of head & heart, and his genial disposition endeared him to all who came in contact with him." (Malta Standard).

Naudi

Naudi, Hon. Dr. Alfredo, C.M.G., LL.D. - Crown Advocate - (1855-1905)

Born in Turin, Italy on April 23, 1855, son of Alessandro Naudi - Master of Italian, Galatheaicum; graduated B.A. at the Malta University in July 1877; entered politics and joined Dr. Fortunato Mizzi's party; was elected by the graduates as member of the Council of Government under the 1887 Constitution where he continued to sit until 1892, where he was one of the most brilliant members; subsided to the blandishments of the Chief Secretary, Count Gerald Skerrett and della Catenor, who in his fight against his erstwhile political leader, Dr. Mizzi, was all out to smash his party and reduce the Council of Government to a mere compliance, instituted a corrupt system of official bribery by offering judgeships and other important official posts to the most influential and important political personalities of his times: Dr. Pagnani himself, Baron von Chapelle, Dr. Agostino Naudi, Dr. Giovanni Pullicino, Dr. Niccolò Rencali, - all accepted judgeships; Dr. Costantino Maggi and Innocent Corrao were appointed Ass. Superintendents of Police; Mag. Vignard crushed the part of liberalism - Dr. Alfredo Naudi as "Naudino" as he was known, was made Professor of Commercial and Criminal Law, (1892-1895) and on January 1, 1895 was appointed to the vital and lucrative post of Crown Advocate. As the legal adviser of the Government, he was held responsible for all the odious and impressive measures in the "Language Question" leading up to the repeal of the Constitution of 1887 in 1903. The political leaders of his times never forgave Naudino his "betrayal" and the betrayal of their cause for the sake of personal advancement.

Dr. Alfredo Naudi died at his summer residence in St. Julian's, aged 51 years, on Thursday, July 6, 1905. His funeral on July 8, was only attended by government officials. Commenting on this pointed abstention by the political and social leaders of his times at the funeral, the "Gazette" wrote in its leader of July 12: "Alla morte di un individuo la cui vita avrà influenzato sui destini del popolo paese, il giudizio del pubblico si pronunzierà".

Naudi Alessandro, - Teacher of Italian, German, and father of Alfredo Naudi C.M.L., M.D., Crown Advocate, died aged 83 years on June 15, 1909.

Naudi, James - (1894-1942) - Born in Helima in 1894, son of Alfredo Naudi and Giocanna ne Londeri; husband of Augusta Bianchi; employed as clerk in Valletta; killed during an air-raid at the entrance of the "Mina-is-Swada" Shelter, top of Sta Lucia, Valletta, aged 48 years, at 10.45 a.m. on the 24th April 1942. Buried in the Addolorata Cemetery.

Naudi, Prof. Cleardo, M.D. - (1780-1837) - Maltese physician, Professor of Chemistry (1805-34) and of Natural History (1824-29) at the Malta University. He turned protestant and translated several English works into Maltese, including Henry's Catechism + part of Wesley's notes on the Old Testament + other books dealing with religious and moral teaching, histories, etc. Died in Valletta, aged 57 years on July 30, 1837. He was reconciled to the Catholic Church on his death bed, and was survived by his wife and two young children, one of whom, Miss Naudi, died a protestant in 1844 and was buried in Misida Bastion Cemetery (No. 157, Zone A.)

Naudi, Gavino - (1835-1902) - Registrar, Courts of Judicial Office - appointed on 16th Sept 1897 - an incurable dipsomaniac, he died in Għabija, aged 54 years on the 29th May 1902, being survived by his daughter, Guiseppina, aged 6 years

and his sister, Mrs. C. Carbone. Gavio Naudi was a very wealthy man; his only daughter and heir was a half-wit and a diabetic from birth. She was brought up in St. Joseph's Convent, Sliema, by her aunt, who stood to inherit her so her expectations of life was not long. Mrs. Carbone's expectations were widely shaken when the nineteen year old heiress was helped by a maternal aunt to a hasty marriage with the inexperienced Reginald Carone Ferrigiani on Jan. 6, 1922; on the day following the marriage the happy groom took his young wife to Victoria Road, where she bequeathed to him every kittle of her property; she died, as expected, in childbirth on April 9, 1923 and was buried in the family vault in Gattin parish church. Her will was contested by her aunt, and the matter was amicably settled out of court by the executor to Mrs. Carbone of a portion of the inheritance. Reginald Carone Ferrigiani remained shortly after his English failure.

Naudi, Alessandro - (1826-1909) - former Italian master at the Mafra Lyceum, and father of the late Prof. Alfredo V. Naudi M.D. Crown Advocate - died aged 83 years on June 15, 1909.

Naudi Willie - (1870-1933) - Shipping clerk, formerly in the employ of the Austro-Hungarian shipping company "Adria" up to the outbreak of the 1st World War, and later of Messrs Bianchi and Co. Died at Peki on Sunday, 18th June 1933, aged 63 years. Survived by his widow and a large family.

Naudi, Dr. Agostino, M.D. - (1783-1830) - Medical Practitioner. Born in Valletta on the 27th February 1783, during the rule of the Mutas, son of Giobatta Naudi and Maria Antonia Vamo; was a medical doctor and surgeon of repute; died in Valletta on the 11th November 1830; his wife Antonia in England had died on the 21st February 1828, being survived by her three sons and three daughters.

Naudi, Fortunato - (1840-1915) - well-known Valletta clock maker - died at his residence in Peki, aged 75 years on Wednesday



the 26th July 1915, and was buried at the Addolorata Cemetery. Survived by his sons, Sub-Inspector A. Naudi, Mr. William Naudi and his daughter, Carmela, wife of Gavino Bouello; and a brother, Mr. Alfonso Naudi.

Naudi Dr Robert LL.D. - (1869-1936) - Barrister. Born in 1869; graduated in laws in October 1894; died at his residence in Sijiri St., Sliema, aged 67 years on Wednesday, the 20th May 1936; survived by his wife, Mrs Galizia, and one daughter, Mary, wife of Mr. J. Galea; and two sisters, Mrs A. Canado and Mrs. P. Sammut.

Naudi, Mrs Elizabeth Walker - (1811-1849) - Widow of Professor Cleardo Naudi M.D., and grand niece to the most Rev. A. Walker, late Archbishop of York, died aged 38 years in Valletta, at 4.30 a.m. on Sunday, 23rd February 1849 after a painful illness of 8 months. Survived by an only son. Her daughter, a Protestant, died 1844 and was buried in the Santa Barbara Cemetery. (See also Dr. Cleardo Naudi).

Montalto Family Meets Duke Montalto Of Fragnito

From a Correspondent

Comm. Fra Enrico Montalto, Duke of Fragnito, met all the members of the local Montalto family at Villa St. Bernard, Lija.

From researches it has been established that there is a definite relationship between the two families in Malta and Italy.

A few years ago, Comm. Fra Enrico Montalto visited Malta. During his very brief stay on the island the Duke was unable to meet all his relatives.

When it was known that the Duke was coming back to Malta to participate in the Great Siege festivities, Mr. F. G. Kitson and the Most Noble Maria Angela Kitson Montalto, Baroness of Benuarrat, daughter of the late Baron Montalto of Benuarrat and of the Dowager Baroness Carolina Montalto, gave a cocktail party at their residence in Villa St. Bernard, Lija, to welcome the illustrious visitor last Thursday. All members of the Montalto family and the close relatives of her mother's, the

Manduca, were invited to this reception; also present were Mgr. Prof. E. Coleiro, Father Muscat, D.D., Parish Priest of Lija, and the Hon. Mabel Strickland, O.B.E., M.P.

Mr. J.M. Verzin who is married to the Noble Dolores Montalto has been compiling a book on the Montalto family.

The Montalto family have a remarkable history. The family's origin goes back to the time of the Vikings in the VII Century up to Othon de Montault in the year 960. A branch was established in France by Eerard de Montault (1248) who took part in the Crusades of the Holy Land with St. Louis IX. This branch extended up to Philippe de Montault, Duke of Navailles, Marshal of France during the reign of Louis XIV.

Another branch was set up in England by Eustace de Montault, who fought with William the Conqueror in the

Battle of Hastings (1066). The successors of this family at present bear the titles of Lords Maude, Barons de Montalt, Viscounts Hawarden.

Various branches of the family were established in Italy, the most famous of which pertained to the Doge of Genoa and to that from which Pope Sisto V was descended.

The Montalto family has had various important relations with Malta and with the Order of St. John.

In 1530 Antonio Montalto signed at Messina the Viceroy's execuator for the donation by Charles V of Malta,

Gozo and Tripoli to the Order of St. John.

In 1565, Virgilio Montalto came at his own expense to help the besieged Island of Malta as Captain of two Gallions which pertained to the Neapolitan fleet.

In 1748 Antonio Montalto captured the Turkish flagship which was carrying the Pasha of Rhodes and took him with it as prisoner to Malta. This episode is very important in the history of Malta for it eventually resulted in the Conspiracy of the Slaves which occurred during the time of Grand Master Pinto.

that he fainted, and was taken home in a dying condition after a severe heart attack, dying at 8.30 p.m. that same evening at his residence, no. 214, Sta Mercanti, Valletta.

The Hon. Mabel Strickland, editor of the "Times of Malta" who was enjoying hugely the witch hunt, in an article published in the Sunday edition, 13th October, 1935, under the title "Safety First" referring to Carmelo Mifsud's sudden death, wrote "The only Maltese who was accused died from shock after being shown some papers bearing his signature; it is impossible that he did not live. The legend that has been spread by some (e.g. "The Daily Malta Chronicle" and the "Gazzetta Malta") cannot be shared by those who love their country. A traitor deserves no sympathy." She took her Mifsud's family, one of whose sons was married to Major Perry Dunckerly's sister, threatened legal action for slander, and accordingly, on Sunday, 29th October 1935, Mabel Strickland, came up her words, and under the title of "Safety First" — (which this time admitted of more than one meaning) — stated that the remarks about her Mifsud was most regretted; that the article was written in a wide sense, and not a personal one, her Mifsud "being a gentleman above suspicion enjoying the esteem and respect of his fellow Countrymen."

Mifsud, Canon Mr M.A., M.D. — Vicar-General of the Diocese of Malta died at Mosta on the morning of Sunday, 11th July 1886. He was a man of high attainments and great learning. He retired from the post of examiner in the Faculty of Law at the Malta University only a short time before his death. Buried at Mosta parish church on July 12 was succeeded in the vacant Canonry by the Rev. Paolo Baulson M.D., Archbishop of Gossime in October of the same year.

Mifsud

Mifsud, Dr Antonio, M.D. - Professor of Midwifery at the Malta University, 1869-1880; died in Valletta on the 13th March 1883, and was buried in Malta parish church.

Mifsud Bonnici, Robbie — (1884-1967) civil pensioner and prolific writer in the Maltese language. "Robbie's" philosophic thought was the naive, M.M. materialist beliefs of those who had received an indifferent education in their youth but which had gradually become an obsession of great knowledge; and a child-like desire to ingratiate himself with the ecclesiastical authorities. His "National Bio-bibliographical" dictionary, started as a re-hash of his "Kompozituri Malti" to which was added the old Melitensis Index which had stopped in 1939 and contained many inaccuracies; to this was added the bio-bibliographical notes of those who agreed to figure in the National Dictionary. Fortunately, the dictionary appeared first in parts in the P.D. Review, under the editorship of Mr. Cesare Pullano who corrected some of the more obvious mistakes.

I met said Robbie alive on Wed. morning 18th October 1967 as I was going out of Kingagake. He told me that he was on his way to the G. U. U. press with the manuscript of his latest work "H. Briedens biema?" and wished to read it to me his friend. He told me that unless he kept on writing he would die. The news of his death was indeed a surprise because he was still hale and hearty. at the Jesuit College, Stonyhurst. Entered the Royal Navy in
1844; mentioned in despatches, 13th July 1853 in connection
with naval operations on the West Coast, Africa; appointed
Commander, and was mentioned as deserving the gratitude
of the Government for his work and ability in quelling the
Moro uprising. His naval career was cut short when he
refused on conscientious grounds, to obey superior orders
to capture a group of native West Coast women for
sale as slaves in accordance with the naval custom of that

Capt. Strickland had been a lifelong friend of Roger

After this tragedy, Tichbourne's mother made world wide
inquiries for news of the fate of her son. She received
a letter from Australia, wherein the writer claimed
he was her son, who had escaped from the disaster
and had found safety in Australia. Mrs Tichbourne
accepted the man as her lost son, but a member
of the family contested his claim, the result being
the famous Tichbourne Case which cost £200,000, the
founder Roger Tichbourne being recognized as an impostor
named Arthur Outow. One of the chief witnesses at the
hearing in 1864 was to be Capt. Walter Strickland, but
a few days before he was due to give evidence, he died
suddenly at Stonyhurst, being buried in the college chapel
where a monument was erected in his memory. His wife was
firm in the belief that her husband had been poisoned in
1864 to prevent his giving his most important testimony.

I have before me your dispatch to be of the 1st instant, forwarding the Report of the Committee of Privileges of the Maltese Nobility on the claims of certain persons whose titles of nobility were disallowed by the Commissioners appointed to inquire into claims to nobility in Malta.

In accordance with the recommendations of this Committee, the following additions should be made to the list of Nobles without prejudice to any decision of a competent Court of Law viz: - Calcedonio Appapada, Barone di Bullem, Luigi Pitt, Conte di Pedersana, Gio Paolo Tebaperrata Olivero, Marchese, and Domingo Casca Masain, Marchese.

As I understand that the claims of other members of the Tebaperrata family to the title of Marchese which were submitted to the Committee are not established to the satisfaction of a majority of the Committee, these will not be recognized as "Titoli".

I request that you will communicate my decision to the Assembly of the Nobles.

Jowett, Rev. William - a Fellow of St. John's College, Cambridge; ordained a priest of the Anglican Church in 1814; resided in Malta except for a few intervals, from 1820 to 1830, when he was the Editor of the publications of the Church Missionary Society. In March 1823 he engaged the services of the poverty-stricken Michael Antonio Vassallo as a translator.

Jackson, Harry Lord ("Biboy") - (1897-1965) - Born in California U. S. A., 11th November 1897, eldest son of Henry Jackson, merchant and owner of Jackson Stone Mills, Maraca, and Lucy nie King. Educated at St. Augustus College, B'ham; commissioned in the R. C. M. P. M during World War I, and played for a season with the Sierra Wanderers. He transferred to the 1st Manchester Regt and then to the Air Force as Pilot Officer. The first and handsome Biboy Jackson and his younger brother Angelo, who was dark-skinned, shared their father's fortune, and were the leaders of the bright young set of Sierra in the early twenties.

In 1921 Biboy Jackson fell under the love of the beautiful Russian wife of Capt Joe Alfred Kom R. M. P., Vera nie Yakovlevna, who later abandoned her husband and two children, Paul and Sonya, and became Biboy's mistress. The lovers went abroad and lived expensively on the Continent. By the year 1929 Biboy Jackson had run through his fortune; his mistress left him to marry a rich Italian, and his luckless lover returned to father penniless. Through the good offices of Lord Strickland he obtained a small post in the government service as auxiliary clerk on 1 July 1929 at a salary of £90 p a. rising by annual increments of £5 to £150. He chose this time to fall in love again with the beautiful Gladys Lanyon, the eldest daughter of his former Lanyon of the Civil Service, who did her best to prevent the match. But Gladys was deeply in love with him and willing to share his poverty. The marriage took place on Jan. 9, 1933. Two daughters were born to him, Clare and Angela. Life for the James, as she and her husband became, became one of drudgery and a struggle to make ends meet, by stitching typing work to earn a few extra shillings, a struggle made heavier by the

McKerrow, Mrs Elizabeth Mary - (1846-1911) - "a Lucknow Girl"

As a girl of eleven she went through the horrors of the Indian Mutiny of 1857-58, and was one of those besieged at Lucknow. The garrison who had received news of the massacre of the garrison of Cawnpore, and the slaughter by order of the Uana Sahib of some two hundred women and children taken prisoners, had determined to kill their own women and children should they be overpowered rather than let them fall into the hands of the enemy mutineers.

"Better to fall by the hands that they love than to fall into theirs"

Elizabeth's father was killed in the fighting during the three terrible months that Lucknow held out until it was relieved by Generals Havelock and Outram on Sept. 7, 1857. The girl later married A. McKerrow who had likewise gone through the same experiences. Elizabeth McKerrow accompanied her soldier husband throughout much of his service career, and appears to have recalled often the horrors of the mutiny which she remembered well.

She died aged in her 65th year, at the Military General Hospital, Valletta, at 5.30 am. on Sunday, 28th March, 1911, and was buried at La Braccia Cemetery on March 29.

She was survived by her husband and seven children, six of whom married in the service, one son being employed in the Customs Dept., China. Her husband Mr. A. McKerrow returned to Scotland in 1915, where he was the guest of several retired commanding officers who had known him during his service career. It was his wish, however, to return to Valletta to be near the resting place of his beloved wife.

One of Mrs McKerrow's daughters recalled her mother's memory in the D.M.C. as "the Lucknow Girl" regularly every year on her death anniversary for many years - which gave rise to the local legend of "the Lucknow Girl".

Nani

Nani Angelo - violinist, and pupil of the celebrated Maggari, he was the favourite musician of Grand Master de Rohan, and settled in Malta in the 18th Century.

Nani Emmanuele - son of Angelo Nani who was also his teacher; born in 1768 and became in his turn a distinguished violinist

Nani, Dr Paolo, LL.D. - distinguished Maltese musician - (1814 - 1904)
Born in Valletta in 1814, son of Mr. Giuseppe Nani and Caterina nee Ricca; was educated privately by the learned Rev. Giuseppe Abela (who later joined the Carmelite Order and was elected Superior General of the Order); graduated in civil and canon laws at the Malta University in December 1833; professed music to the laws and studied under the Rev. Giuseppe Burton of Birgna; and in July 1834 left for Naples where he studied under the celebrated Masters Linguitta and Bonipatti. After his return to Malta he succeeded his V. Superior in 1840 as Maestro di Cappella of St Paul Superiore, Valletta; appointed in 1839, Maestro di Cappella of the Carmelite Basilica in Valletta and also of other important parish Churches; in 1841 was concert master at the Royal Theatre (Manoel) but after 1848, he limited his theatrical activities to the rehearsal of the Operas which were later conducted by his brother-in-law and his son Antonio Nani. In 1879 he was elected member of the Philharmonic Academy of Bologna, among the Composers. He died aged 90 years on March 22, 1904, being then also the doyen of the legal profession.

Works: "Mezzanotte" - opera, performed in 1845 (written in 1844) at the Manoel, under the direction of the author. Sacred music and hymns, including the celebrated "Sancte Pauli", and other minor pieces.

Nani Antonio - Maltese musician and composer - (1842 - 1929)
Born in Valletta in October 1843, son of Dr. Paolo Nani ^{and Maddalena Casolani;} he received his musical instruction under his father and Father Spirito Zammit;

Nani.

went to Naples in 1867 and continued his studies in the Conservatory under Agnolo Barbuti and Ugo Mioda de Gioia, until 1877.

On his return to Malta he found the musical circles and societies in the island divided into two parties, the "Nani" and the "Bugija", the partisanship extending to the church functions and festas and carried to ludicrous limits.

In 1885 he took over the Impresaria of the Royal Theatre, the highlight of the season being the presentation of Boito's *Mephistofele*, and "*La Gioconda*" in 1886. After the death of his father in 1904 he assumed the direction of the activities of parish churches under his charge, and so the leadership of the "Nani" party. He died aged 87 years on the 25th February 1929.

Works:

"Zorilla" - c. opera - performed Th. Rodini, Naples, in March 1872, and for the first time in Malta at the Grand Theatre in 1874; libretto by Almerindo Spaditta.

"I Cavalieri di Malta" - Malta, Th. Royal, 16 Jan. 1880, under the direction of the author; performed again in 1925 at the Grand Theatre. Libretto by Enrico Gattisiani.

"Adonise Visconti" - Malta, Th. Royal, 18 Jan. 1889, under the direction of the author.

In addition, a vast inventory of sacred music, including a highly successful "Funeral Mass", and other minor pieces. Nani was the first president of the "Camera degli Autori e Compositori di Musica Maltese".

Navarro Abbé Gioacchino — Librarian — (1748-1813)

Born in 1748, he was appointed librarian in succession to Canon Agius de Soldano, which post he held from 1773 to 1812; died aged 65 years on Jan. 1, 1813.

He was responsible for the transfer of the library from the old premises near the Casino Palace to the new building built especially for the purpose, but which, during the early years of the British occupation had been used as a military club. When the transfer was effected it was found that thousands of books of the original collection had disappeared — it was presumed during the troubled years of the Blockade.

Nicholas Virtu Alfred - for many years clerk to the Council of the Chamber of Commerce, died on Sunday, July 11, 1926.

Nixon, Prof. William F., M.A., A.R.C.Sc. (Lond) - Professor of Higher Mathematics - (1869-1944)

Born in England on the 29th August 1869; Appointed Professor of Higher Mathematics at the Malta University in 1902, and of Mechanics in 1905; returned on furlough on the 29th August 1934; suffered severely from shrapnel when bombs were dropped near his residence in Picta on June 12, 1940; died aged 75 years in Rabat on the 22nd April 1944.

Married Melita Mary Reichmanes (b. 24-6-1887) on the 27th December 1902 by whom he had a son, William, and a daughter Mary Gertrude

Nicosia, Alfred - (1866-1927) - prominent Maltese merchant - died in Sicily, aged 61 years on Tuesday, 18th January 1927. Survived by his wife, Willy nee Turaball, several sons and a daughter

Nicolaccio, Rev. Antonio de - (15~ - 1592) - The son of a noble of Rhodes who accompanied the Order of St. John after the capture of the island by the Turks on Jan. 1, 1523, he was brought by his parents to Malta after the cession of the Island to the Order in 1530, and was baptized a Catholic in the parish church of St. Lawrence, Birgu. He entered the church and was appointed the first parish priest of Senglea by Bishop Gargallo on June 3, 1581; ruled his parish for eleven years until 1592 when feeling his end near, he retired to Vittoriosa after resigning the parish and where he died and was buried in St. Lawrence Church.

Nicosia Paolo - (1860-1919) - Manager of the Farm Turaball junior & Somerville - Died at the Blue Sisters Hospital after a short illness of barely a week at 10 am. on Saturday, 31 May 1919, aged 59 years. Buried at the Addolorata Cemetery at 2 pm on June 1.

love and loyalty of his wife). The outbreak of war in September 1939 brought about a sudden change in his circumstances. He was re-commissioned in the rank of pilot-officer in the R.A.F. and could taste again the old life. He was demobilized in 1945 and returned to his post as auxiliary officer at the Law Courts, which was made permanent and re-styled "Clerical Officer" in 1947. He was then transferred to the High Court, where an auxiliary employee could earn extra money by the sale of lottery tickets.

In 1953 his eldest daughter, carefully educated at the Sacred Heart Convent School developed an infatuation for the well known pianist and band-leader, Jimmy Dowling, a married man. The girl would listen to his records, and left home to become Dowling's mistress, although he also did his best to dissuade her from such a step. A child was born to her, and motherhood apparently put some sense in her. She left her lover, got a job as air hostess to support her child, and became reconciled with her parents. After retiring on pension on reaching the age limit of 60 in 1957 Bibsy Jackson emigrated with his wife and daughters to England where my brother, Major Frank Fenwick met him in 1965, when he was living in Hampstead. Bibsy Jackson was then a very sick man. He died after an operation in a London hospital on September 6, 1965, aged 67 years. He was survived by his wife Gladys, his daughters, Clare and Angela, his brother Hugh, and his half-sister, Lina, wife of Maj. Louis Canada (RMA (ret)) and Rita, wife of Rear Admiral W. D. O'Brien.
