SYNOPSIS

"INVITATION TO A MARCH" was first produced in 1960 in New York City. The play not only revived the "comic aside" but it introduced to the stage a young lady previously only beginning her career in the movies, Miss Jane Fonda in the role of Norma Brown. Critics received "Invitation" with mixed feelings; some did not all tegether approve of the convention of actors speaking directly to the audience, some did not believe that such subjects as illegitimate sons (or daughters for that matter) and "free lovt" were material for comic expression, especially as the author refused to solve the problems of the play either happily or unhappily. As the 60's presented a great many problems theatrically and otherwise, this play was just one of many that set out to involve its audience more deeply.

"INVITATION TO A MARCH" is more than just a Comedy with very down to earth dialogue, it is a fantasy as well: — "Do people really sleep with their eyes open?" Arthur Laurents has written o comedy of manners with a number of moral and social prob'ems without offering to answer the questions presented.

Camilla Jablonski had an illegitimate son 20 years ago and refused to invent a father — now that son "thinks" he's fallen in love but doesn't want to get married. Both mother and son state their reasons for not "marching" with convention — but what about living with society and its demands? Norma Brown and her mother Lily have always lived in a very orderly conventional world — "Life is the same as it always was and no invention invented ever changed it" — "Marching with Society" is the answer that they can live with best.

The other side of the triangle, Tucker and Deedee Grogan and their son Schuyler, who wants to marry Norma, answer the question yet another way — "was this heroine living so free and gallant or just being damn selfish — family and social position must rule your life."

"Invitation" was a true product of the sixties — everything changiny so fast and this play was just a sample of what was to come in the 70's.


