Hec est conventio facta inter Radulphus de Amundaville et inter fratres de Sancto Lazaro Ierosolimitano: quod fratres debent invenire victuin et vestitum quatuor leprosis, qui sunt in domo hospitali de Carleton vita eorum leprosozum durante, sine aliis leprosis recipiendis, scilicet quatuor leprosos quos in domo hospitali de Carleton invenerunt quando elemosinam receperunt, et post dissessionem eorum elemosina quieta leprosis sancti Lazari de Jerusalem, sicut carta Radulphi de Amundaville testatur, sine omni impedimento; et quod Radulphus de Amundaville et fratres de Sancto Lazaro debent edificare illum locum communi consilio eorum et hanc domum et istos quatuor leprosos receperunt, et hanc condencionem fecerunt, et hanc elemosinam receperunt ad festum sancti Johannis Baptiste proximum, postquam juvenis rex Gallie suam uxorem sponsavit.
