

THE GOZO BOAT

Anthony Grech

On establishing the Gozo Philatelic Society, members had to chose an adequate logo. Some suggested the usual three hills, but others wanted a logo which had both a Gozitan and philatelic connection. The choice fell on the Gozo Boat. The Gozo Boat was the first image with our Island connection to be seen on a Malta stamp issued in 1886.

In fact this set of six stamps was the first Malta pictorial set. All stamps issued in Malta before this one depicted Queen Victoria, the reigning monarch of Great Britain and its dependencies. In 1911 the same design was repeated in two different values and in 1922 the Gozo Boat could be seen on many stamps of the Melita set. In 1926 a new set was issued and our boat found its place on the 2/6d stamp. This time the design was more detailed and elaborate and the words 'Gozo Boat' was inscribed.

At Mgarr, Gozo, home of the Gozo Boat or *Dgħajsa tal-Latini* there was once an important small boat building industry mainly run by the Caruana brothers (Gużeppi and Eugenio) and their sons. This industry today is almost extinct due to modern technology. Recently Gozo Channel commissioned

Mr. Peter Caruana, son of the late master boat builder Gużeppi who was the original builder to restore to its original glory one of the boats, the 'Sagra Familja'. This was a great challenge to Peter, but the result gave satisfaction to this master and to the Gozo Channel company who saved it from total destruction and loss. A look at the photos of how it was and how it is now might give a small idea of the work it involved to be restored. On its completion the 'Sagra Familja' was handed over to 'Wirt Ghawdex', the Gozitan NGO who takes care to preserve all that is Gozitan. Today this boat is placed in a prominent place at Mgarr Harbour promenade to be admired by all.

Even in its depleted condition, the Gozo Boat looks more majestic than the two modern box like structures called boats.

Artists painted it, authors wrote about it, singers praised it and poets lamented its end. Perhaps the poem '*Id- Dgħajsa tal-Latini*' is one of the best poems which describes the end of the Gozo Boat. Written by Dr. Anton Buttigieg ex President of Malta, a Gozitan himself who knew very well what all Gozitans feel when they have to cross the channel to Malta.




The intention of this humble article is not to save the Gozo boat building industry. This is already lost, but at least to try to save Maltese names of the parts which such boats were built of. Incredibly a Gozo boat was made up of 53 parts. Here is a list in Maltese and in English of these parts compelled by Mr. Joseph Caruana son of a master boat builder of the Gozo Boat and brother of Peter Caruana who restored and brought to its glory again "*The Sagra Familja*".





it's not amiss to end the year with a short look at Philatelic

Antoine Vassallo

FOOTBALL FIRSTS



Italy offered a full nine-stamp set in 1934 to commemorate the edition - the second ever - of the Football World Cup held there. The seven designs by Ortona and Ferri (three of the stamps shared the same one) show action shots, as well as three stadia: specifically, those at Turin, Florence and Bologna. These stamps were also printed in different colours (and, as usual, overprinted) for the Aegean Islands, then a colony.



Much earlier - in 1925 - Hungary had issued a Helbing-designed set to help sport funding, one of the stamps showing goalmouth action. And in 1928 the Netherlands - within a set for the Amsterdam Olympics - produced a simple design (by Wenckebach) showing a footballer.



However the medal for the first football stamp should probably go to a two-value 1924 set issued by Uruguay to celebrate its victory in the Olympic football tournament; strangely enough, this is not specified in the design itself which just reproduces the



Samothrace Nike (“Victory”). Various later issues feature this set as “stamp on stamp”. I limit myself to the miniature sheet (designed by Gurewitsch) in the 1964 Olympic set: it showed an example, together with one from the 1928 set for another Olympic tournament won. Uruguay had something else to shout about in 1950: its national team famously carried off the World Cup itself. Two stamps (in a common design) were issued the next year, in different perforations. This is considered as the first set to celebrate such an honour.



In 1952 neighbour Brazil became the first country to directly feature a football club, for the fiftieth anniversary of Fluminense - as mentioned on the stamp actually for the Olympics.

Individual specified footballers were first shown in a 1955 set (the work of Chavarry) by Guatemala to commemorate the Golden Jubilee of the game in this Central American country. The two named are Mario

Camposeco and Carlos Aguirre Matheu. The goalie featured defending his net on the other stamp remains unidentified!

Malta issued its first set of World Cup Football Championship in 1978. The three

stamps and a miniature sheet designed by Anthony De Giovanni show three different actions.



To return to the country we began with, Italy issued a stamp in 1987 to celebrate Napoli as that year's national league champions. This first example - designed by Cozzella - has been imitated by various others!

E & O not E (36)

glances at stamps with design or printing mistake
(well-known or obscure) Antoine Vassallo.



Welcome to a special Christmas edition!

oday I present four assorted errors, beginning with Antigua. This island is not unique in offering Christmas sets simply made up of Old Masters or other museum paintings. However carelessness was too apparent in 1978, two of the values - though with a "religious" theme - had nothing really to do with Christmas. They were luckier in the choice of the third painting: a detail from Sebastiano del Piombo's *La Sainte Famille avec sainte Catherine, saint Sébastien et un donneur* (as described by the Louvre Museum where it is exhibited). Unfortunately the stamp prominently declares that the artist is Peter Paul Rubens!



Australia had not made a good choice either for the 1974 Christmas airmail letter (or aerogramme). The illustration (from a Dürer Apocalypse woodcut) does show an angel but it is a Doomsday Angel!

There is no design problem about the third mistake: the GB 1971 Christmas set in fact reproduces stained-glass windows in Canterbury Cathedral, this stamp showing the Magi. I give an example of one of numerous missing colours, resulting in an omitted Queen's head. This is nothing exceptional since in those days the sheets had still to pass through the presses separately for each colour – the problem was possibly quality control!

I conclude with Malta, actually just one item from the Juncker collection. Chev E V Cremona gave a strong personal imprint on the numerous stamps he designed, including innovative presentations. A typical example was




the unusually-shaped 1967 Christmas set. However errors do crop up in the best of company: one of the four colours used was missed out. The omitted red resulted in the stars becoming white: remaining an attractive stamp, this clear error is not terribly expensive.



A 17th century tower known as ta' Gorgun, at Xewkija, Gozo, dismantled (with a never kept promise to be rebuilt after the war) by Americans stationed there during World War II to construct a temporary airstrip. The tower was a fortified farmhouse with its own moat and drawbridge. An exact model of this tower is displayed at the Gozo Museum of Archaeology in Rabat.





This year's Exhibition was opened on Friday 14 November by Dr Grezzju Mercieca (representing the indisposed Gozo Minister) after referring to various positive aspects of our hobby. The short ceremony, with the support of Pro Stage Sound, included the launch of the revamped website www.stamps-gozo.org as upgraded by new webmaster John Luke Debrincat. After Chaplain Fr Gerald Buhagiar led prayers and Secretary Antoine Vassallo expressed thanks, those present were invited to go around the exhibits and to partake of the reception prepared by Louis Bonello and Anthony Grech.

Since - after various years - we could be allotted again the main hall at the Gozo Ministry, we were able to increase the number of showcases so that all applications could be allocated as much space as requested. The high level of exhibits (not excluding expensive and rarer examples), in both the junior and open classes, was thus well displayed. Comments by visitors were positive indeed.

A prominent notice commemorated major supporter Krista Juncker, committee member Emmanuel Vella and founder-officer George Vella who all died this year. Non-competing exhibits included a display by main sponsors MaltaPost and further items from the Juncker Collection.

Judging (by Joseph Buttigieg, Samuel Parnis and Antoine Vassallo) took place on Saturday in all classes. Criteria used for Juniors were treatment, knowledge, presentation and originality; those for the Open classes were additionally rated for completeness and rarity. As usual, prizes and certificates will be distributed to all participants during the Annual General Meeting.





examples of unusual stamp production

Novelist Sir Arthur Conan Doyle is best known for his famous creation Sherlock Holmes. Rather than following the family tradition of pursuing an artistic career, Conan Doyle chose to study medicine at Edinburgh University. At this time he wrote a short story called "The Mystery of Sasassa Valley" which got published in the important Chambers' Journal. In May 1891, whilst writing some of the early Holmes stories, he was struck by a severely dangerous bout of influenza. Once his health had improved, he decided to abandon his medical career in favour of his literary one. "The Adventures of Sherlock Holmes" - the first collection - was published in 1892, greeted with huge acclaim. At one point he even got tired of the character and decided to get rid of Holmes by trying to kill him off in "The Final Problem"!

The island of Alderney commemorated Conon Doyle's 150th Birth Anniversary



through a set of six stamps (designed by Keith Robinson) showing scenes from a new story: "The Curious Case of the Alderney Bull". Cartor Security printed them in sheetlets with enlarged illustrated margins.



These specialist printers have developed many innovative techniques but there is nothing special in this respect here. However this issue still was a "philatelic first". A miniature sheet was only available in a "Mystery Pack", including a DVD featuring two Sherlock Holmes movies. The exclusive story is there too:

by reading it, studying the pictures and scouring the stamps for clues, both stamp collectors and whodunit aficionados were challenged to crack the secret code and solve the mystery.

12 - Epirus - What was that?! (1914)

Epirus is a rough mountainous region located along the Ionian Sea in the border area of Greece and Albania. Under the rule of the Ottoman Empire for almost 500 years, it consisted mainly of an ethnic Greek population. During the First Balkan War (1912-1913), the inhabitants of what was called Chimarra expelled the Ottoman forces in order to join Greece. However, the northern part of Epirus was later awarded to the newly created Albania.

Unwilling to be a part of Albania, Northern Epirus revolted in February 1914 and a provisional government proclaimed an autonomous republic. After fierce guerrilla fighting, the Corfu Protocol was signed in May of 1914, officially allowing for self government and recognising the rights of the Greek population.

World War 1 broke out just a few weeks after and Albania soon collapsed into chaos. This caused Greek forces to re-occupy the territory - and

the Autonomous Republic ceased to exist. At the end of the war, Northern Epirus was awarded to Greece but it became part of Albania after 1924. A series of handstamped local stamps was issued in February 1914, featuring a double-headed eagle along with skull and crossbones. The inscription approximately translates as: “Greek Autonomous Epirus –

Freedom or Death – Defend our Country”. The four stamps had a control mark representing the revolutionary commander at Chimarra. Most copies in existence are reprints or fakes. The first “official” stamps began being issued a few days after, showing an infantryman aiming his rifle. The inscription reads Autonomous Epirus or, simply, Epirus.



In August another set showed the flag of Epirus. Overprints exist for use in Koritsa and unofficials for Moschopolis.

Overprinted Greek Stamps were later used, again counterfeited. Additionally, others were issued for propaganda purposes.


Unfortunately, ethnic tensions still flare up.



Qrendi Maltese town with "village" canceller (originally "Crendi") from 1900; post office from 1989

Quadrillè paper page ruled (or watermarked) in faint squares

Quadruplicate labels consisting of four parts (perforated or rouletted)

Quadripartition four stamps that together form a complete design

Quarter a fourth part of a divisible stamp

Quiati State in Hadramaut and Quaiti State of Shahr & Mukalla

Aden Protectorate States (with own stamps from 1942) incorporated in South Yemen in 1967

Quan Buu military stamps of Viet Nam, 1960s




