World Photography Day Celebrations by david 'dp' attard

Searches over the internet show that World Photography Day was initially celebrated around 20 years ago. A good number of people I spoke to, and who have photography at heart were not aware that World Photography Day is commemorated on the 19th of August 2011. Why is that? Some of the more cynical amongst us might argue that this



is because World Photography Day was not created by one of the big camera brands as a marketing tool and therefore it does not receive the required worldwide marketing exposure it deserves.

The date chosen to commemorate World Photography Day is associated with the invention of the Daguerreo type,

> photographic process а developed by Louis Daguerre and Joseph Nicéphore Niépce. It was on the 9th of January, 1839, that The French Academy of Sciences presented the Daguerreo type photographic process. A few months later, on August 19, 1839, the French Government announced the invention as a free gift to the world. It is also worthy to note that in 1839, William Fox Talbot invented another photographic process, the Calotype, which process was



formally announced in 1841.

World Photography Day is a commemoration by photographers for photographers. This was the approach taken by the Malta Photographic Society to commemorate this special day in Malta when photographers across the globe get together to celebrate photography, just because they can and just because they want to.

It appears that the World Photography Day celebration is gaining additional momentum with each passing year. This year, the Malta Photographic Society organized various activities at The Point in Tigne spread over two days (19th and photographers who happened to be in Malta during this period. This activity was successful and proved to be a hit participating with all who photographers happily spent hours taking photographs at the various stands set up. A big well done goes to all

MPS Photographer of the Year Competition & Award

he Malta Photographic Society (MPS), Photographer of the Year Competition is being re-vamped with effect from 1 Sep 2011. The aim of this competition is to select a member of the Society who, through a series of internal photographic print competitions, obtains the highest number of points in one season and is awarded the MPS Photographer of the Year. The Malta Photographic Society, Photographer of the Year Competition is based on four different photographic panels and a portfolio each consisting of five prints. A member of the Society who desires to participate in the MPS Photographer of the Year Award must participate in a minimum of two panels and in the portfolio competition. The declared winner is the member who obtains the highest number of points after all five competitions are held. Any member of the Malta Photographic Society whether in the Advanced or the Entry Category can participate in and win the MPS Photographer of the Year Award. Members who intend participating in the Photographer of the Year Award are to signify their intent in the

appropriate form to the Executive Committee by the end of September 2011. The panels and portfolio presented also serve as standalone MPS internal competitions in their own right and shall be awarded accordingly. The themes for 2011-2012 are Maltese culture & heritage panel in monochrome format planned for December 2011, the photo-journalism panel in colour format planned for January 2012, the portraiture panel in monochrome format planned for February 2012, the nature panel in colour format planned for March 2012 and the portfolio in colour format planned for April 2012. The image areas (i.e. excluding borders) of the monochrome or colour prints submitted must measure between a maximum dimension of 30 cms by 40 cms and a minimum dimension of 20 cms by 30 cms. Prints must be mounted in either flush or border format. Mounts must always be in square or rectangular format, but print borders may be of any colour or form. The maximum print size including borders or mount must not exceed 50 cms by 40 cms.

Mentoring Competitions

he Malta Photographic Society is as from 1st September 2011, introducing Mentoring Competitions to offer participating members formal mentoring and feedback sessions within a competitive environment. The Society shall organise six Mentoring competitions within every Competition Season of the Society. Mentoring Competitions shall assist members in the Entry Category to take their first steps in competitions, and to obtain feedback from both the panel of judges and as well as their peers without incurring major printing expenses. They also provide members in the Advanced Category with the opportunity to test the waters and obtain feedback by presenting differing photographic styles

or approaches to their photography. Each Mentoring Competition is followed by a mentoring and discussion session in open forum format. The Mentoring Competitions shall be in the digital projected images format and the image file format should be jpeg. The file resolution should not be more than 1024 pixels (horizontal) by 768 pixels (vertical) at

300 dpi. Compression ratio when saving the file should be set at 12. Colour space should be sRGB and the file size should not exceed 3 MB. The titles for the upcoming season of Mentoring Competitions are 'free subject,' fashion', and 'yellow' in the colour category format and 'free subject,' emotions' and 'movement' in the monochrome format.

Professor Joseph M. Pirotta was born in Sliema in June, 1941, and now resides in Fgura. Initially, Joe began to take photos during outings with friends and family. Very quickly, he realised the potential of photography. In 1963 he bought his first camera, after which he upgraded to a Braun rangefinder with two interchangeable lenses. In 1966, he bought a Pentax Spotmatic SLR, converted a room at home into a darkroom and became thoroughly hooked on photography.

Joe joined the Malta Photographic Society in 1966 but reluctantly resigned in 1970 because of his studies, research and other pressures of work. He rejoined the Society in 2009, nine months after he retired from the University of Malta, where he served as Head of the Department of International Relations. Joe declares that it was then that he was confronted by the digital age of photography. He readily admits that he finds the ongoing personal

exercise to adjust to this development as highly enjoyable.

Presently Joe is the owner of an Olympus E30 and an Olympus E410 camera body with a Zuiko 25 mm f2 lens, a Zuiko 50 mm macro f2 lens, a Sigma 50 mm f1.4 lens, together with two Zuiko zoom lenses, an 11-22 mm f2.8-3.5 lens, and a 50-200 mm f2.8-3.5 lens.

Joe is always fascinated by the play of light and the visual impact such play has on an image. He believes that this visual impact is more true with monochrome images which were his first love. He likes photographs that make a statement, where the more subtle the statement the better. His preferred photographic subjects are candids, unusual situations, street photography, portraits and landscapes.

Amongst others he likes the photography of Ansel Adams, Cartier Bresson, Lord Townsend, David Bailey, John Cornish, Andrew Newey, and locally Richard Ellis as



well as a host of other photographers.

Since rejoining the Society, Joe attended the Starting Photography Course and the Photoshop Course for Beginners. He finds the Society lectures very helpful, the monthly competitions

stimulating and enjoys the sense of comradeship that exists within the same Society, where members can obtain lots of advice. He participates regularly in local photographic competitions as he believes that improvement results by constantly comparing one's work with the best work others produce. Since August 2010, he regularly participated in international competitions and succeeded in having 146 acceptances in 44 Salons in 18 different countries where he was also awarded two Silver medals, an Honourable Mention and a Certificate of Merit for his photographic work.

Joe would like to see the Society develop even further by making itself better known,

especially among aspiring photographers. He would also like the Society to increase its practical courses and to find ways to contribute towards the fostering of photography in schools.

Joe forms part of the Malta Photographic Society's sub-committee responsible for the production of the 50th Anniversary Book, which book is currently going to print.

Besides photography, Joe is also interested in reading, writing, sports (particularly football), and cinematography.

Prof. Joseph Pirotta is married to Maria, née Abela, and has two sons

National Open Annual Photographic Exhibition

Sin Valletta is for the second year in Valletta is for the second year in succession hosting the Malta Photographic Society's National Open Annual Photographic Exhibition between the 9th of September and the 9th of October, 2011.

The exhibition showcases some of the best photographs produced by Maltese photographers during the past year. No

The Malta Photographic Society had no less than 93 different photographers participating in this annual competition, which ran for a record 46th consecutive year. The participants submitted a grand total of 747 images: 284 images in the colour print format, 211 images in the monochrome print format and 252 images in the projected image format. This high level of participation was another record of



less than 150 printed images in both colour and monochrome format as well as over 100 photographs in digital projected image format are on display. The selection of exhibits followed from the results obtained during the National Open Annual Photographic Competition organized earlier this year by the same Society. significant note for the Society.

The central location in Valletta of St James Cavalier Centre for Creativity and the duration of this foremost national photographic exhibition enables the Malta Photographic Society to reach out to a much wider audience that includes not only photographers but also the general public. The photographic exhibition shall this year also form part of the Notte Bianca activities organised in the capital city of Valletta on the night of 1st of October

2011.

The summer (5th July to 14th September) visiting hours for St James Cavalier are: Monday to Friday, 9 am to 1 pm, Saturday and Sunday, 10 am to 1 pm. After the 15th of September, the Centre shall be open as follows: Monday & Tuesday from 9am to 5pm, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday from 9 am to 9 pm and Saturday and Sunday from 10 am to 9 pm.

EFIAP Levels

The requirements that need to be met to obtain the first two FIAP distinctions were outlined in the previous editions of **Click**. This edition of **Click** discusses the next step i.e. the EFIAP level. The EFIAP award was established to honour photographic artists who, after receiving the EFIAP distinction continue to actively participate in international salons under FIAP Patronage and by so doing, help promote photography with their artistic input. There are four EFIAP levels, namely Excellence FIAP Bronze (EFIAP/b), Excellence FIAP Silver (EFIAP/s), Excellence FIAP Gold (EFIAP/g) and Excellence FIAP Platinum (EFIAP/p).

Candidates must meet the following criteria to be considered for such EFIAP levels. They must be holders of the EFIAP distinction or a previous EFIAP level for at least one year, with the one year commencing from the date of the award of the diploma. Candidates must obtain the following number of minimum photographic acceptances for the following awards:

- a: EFIAP/b: 75 acceptances with at least 25 different works
- b: EFIAP/s 150 acceptances with at least 50 different works
- c: EFIAP/g 300 acceptances with at least 100 different works
- d: EFIAP/p 600 acceptances with at least 200 different works

All photographic acceptances listed above must be received after the date of the award of the previous EFIAP distinction. A candidate for these distinctions must also submit the following number of photos:

- a: EFIAP Bronze: 3 distinct photographs awarded in different countries,
- b: EFIAP Silver: 4 distinct photographs awarded in different countries,
- c: EFIAP Gold: 5 distinct photographs awarded in different countries,
- d: EFIAP Platinum: 6 distinct photographs awarded in different countries

These photographs must be different from those photographs submitted for the other distinctions.
