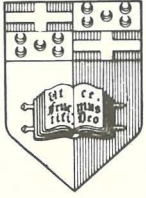
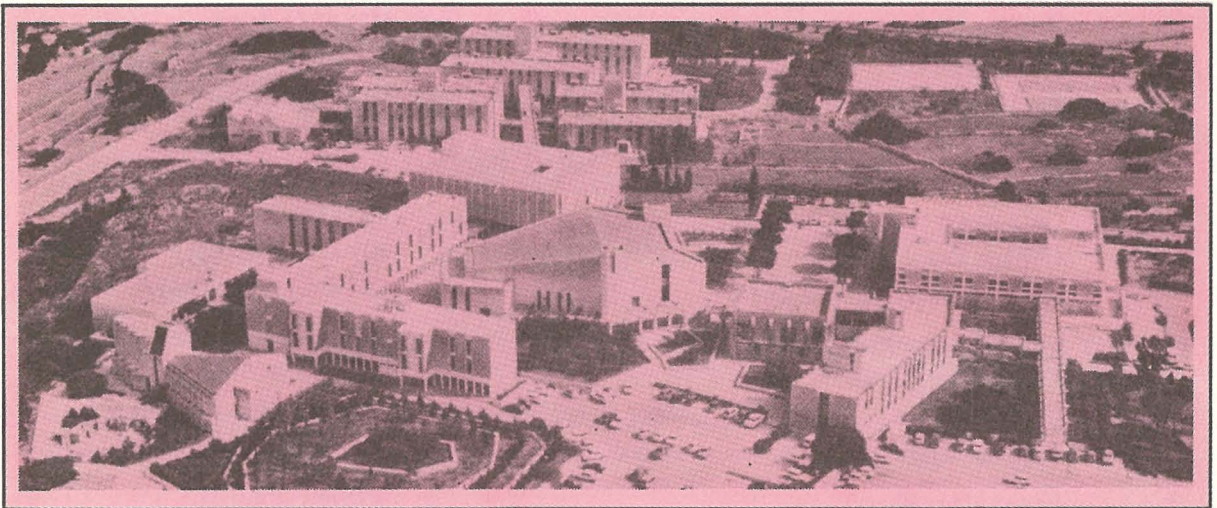

FOR THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION AND ENVIRONMENT
IN CONNECTION WITH
THE PROGRAMME FOR THE UNIVERSITY IN 1987

The University of Malta – 1,448 worker-students were registered in February, 1986 and 389 evening diploma/degree students were pursuing courses in the semester February-June 1986.

The University has maintained steady growth in the continuing education programmes; this development is associated with expansion in the evening degree courses. Each programme is modular in structure, so that courses make up the degree. Courses, that are of interest to the student, may be chosen or arrangements may be made for a pattern of courses to develop a central theme. The modular course structure carries a credit system and this leads to the Bachelor of Arts degree. These courses, spread over a period of five years, are punctuated with diploma and higher diploma status at the end of the third and sixth semesters respectively. The objective is to reach further into the community by providing the opportunity and the challenge.

In 1987, the on-going worker-student courses will be supplemented by degree courses in Arts and Science that will be more liberal in outlook and less tailored to meet specific professional careers and vocational skills.

With a view to improving academic quality and efficiency, the University plans to establish a unit to formulate staff development programmes. This initiative should contribute towards improved design and content of University courses and provide clear operational goals in the various academic sectors.

226 students are expected to complete their degree studies in 1987: 68 Doctors of Medicine, 15 Architects and Civil Engineers, 8 Mechanical Engineers, 20 Electrical Engineers, 52 Teachers, 27 Accountants, 19 Business Managers, 8 Public Administrators, 9 Dental Surgeons. They will exercise their profession and give service to the community. The standards attained by these graduates will continue to enhance the prestige of the University and benefit the Island that has supported their studies.
