



During the night of the 12 and 13 November, a large quantity of oil was thrown in the water at our latest nature reserve at Is-Simar in Xemxija Bay. This was discovered by some of our volunteers who went there to plant some trees. In the area they found 11 empty jerrycans. Immediately the police were informed, and are investigating the case.

The Reserve is at the moment host to several birds including grebes, coots and ducks. The oil besides being hazardous to the birds could also destroy the natural vegetation, which has now started to develop.

absorbent pads in the polluted areas was carried out. Every few days MOS volunteers replace the oil-filled pads to absorb as much as possible of this oil.

This malicious act is another in the series of similar attempts to intimidate MOS in bringing about better bird protection in our islands. Some hunters apparently do not realise the harm these irresponsible acts have on public opinion. Instead of coming to terms with an ever growing awareness in conserving nature, they insist on blasting any flying creature out of the sky.




Mr Raymond Spiteri, a hunter from Naxxar was fined Lm100 and his shotgun confiscated for killing a protected bird, an Oystercatcher, in the closed season from a dinghy within 3kms from the coast.

A birdtrapper was arrested after he allegedly attacked a Briton who apparently was filming the trapping site at Baħar iċ-Ċagħaq. An argument ensued and the Briton was attacked by the trapper and had his camera taken away. Some men who happened to be in the vicinity intervened and informed the police.

At around 2.00pm on the 16th November, 2 hunters in broad daylight cut the fence at Is-Simar Nature Reserve, and entered this protected area. There they shot a bird, retrieved it and left. This incident was reported to MOS who in turn informed the police. By the time MOS officials and the Police arrived, it was too late to do anything about it. This incident seems to be more of a show of defiance unless, hunters have now added wirecutters as part of their hunting gear.

On the 12th November, MOS issued the following Press Release:
A flock of about 50 Short-Toed Eagles (Ajkla



Bajda) was shot whilst migrating over the Maltese Islands.

At least 13 of the eagles were shot from Mizieb whilst another 25 were shot from Wardija. This eagle is declining and in danger of becoming extinct.

The eagles which came to Malta probably arrived from Yugoslavia where the bird is said to be rare. The shooting in Malta has probably destroyed a large percentage of this population.

The Malta Ornithological Society (MOS) strongly condemns such killing and calls upon the police to step up their efforts that illegal shooting is stopped.

On a wall on the road leading from the outskirts of Mosta to San Pawl tat-Tarġa, and a boundary wall at Xemxija were the scenes of slogans painted in favour of hunting and against MOS.
