## **CHRISTMAS STAMPS**

One of the most interesting thematic subjects is surely collecting Christmas stamps. A lot of countries have issued and are still issuing stamps to commemorate the birth of Christ


Malta is no exception. It issued the first Christmas stamps on the 3rd November 1964. These stamps were designed by Chev. E.V. Cremona, On the 8th November 1971. Malta issued the first miniature sheet. This was also a Christmas set In fact the first 3 miniature sheets were all issued for Christmas; the other two being issued in 1972 (9th December) and in 1973 (10th November). Since 1969 the Christmas postage stamps have carried a small surcharge. The money derived from this surcharge is donated to charitable and philanthropic organisations.



## THE AMERICAN NATIONAL POSTAL MUSEUM

The National Postal Museum is located on the lower level of the historic City Post Office Building, which was constructed



in 1914 and served as the Washington D.C., post office from 1914 to 1986. The museum occupies 75,000 square feet of the building with 23,000 square feet devoted to exhibition space. The museum also houses a 6,000 square foot research library, a stamp store and a museum shop.

Visitors enter the museum through the lobby of the building and proceed to escalators that transport them down to the floor level of the museum's 90-foot-high atrium. The atrium, which features three suspended airmail planes, is one of five exhibit galleries that tells the story of postal history in America.

The National Philatelic Collection was established at the Smithsonian in 1886 with the donation of a sheet of 10-cent Confederate postage stamps. Generous gifts from individuals and foreign governments, transfers from government agencies and occasional purchases have increased the collection to today's total of more than 16 million items.  $\rightarrow$ 








Symbols of the United States include the American flag and the Great Seal. The eagle on the seal holds an olive branch and arrows, symbolizing a desire for peace but the ability to wage war. The reverse side bears the Eye of Providence, representing God, and a pyramid dated 1776.



From 1908 until 1963, the collection was housed in the Smithsonian's Arts and Industries Building on the National Mall, in display cases shown on the right. In 1964, the collection was moved to what is now known as the National Museum of American History. There the collection expanded to include postal history

and stamp production. The collection was then moved to its present location and the National Postal Museum opened on the 30th July 1993.

In addition to the stamps, the National Postal Museum has postal stationery, postal history material that pre-dates stamps, vehicles used to transport the mail, mailboxes, meters, greeting cards, covers and letters.





## **THE INVERTED JENNY**

When the U.S. post issued their first airmail stamp in May 1918, philatelists were immediately on the lookout for any errors, that were not uncommon amongst previous issues of bicoloured stamps.

Back then, aeroplanes were new on the

scene, so the War Department and Post Office were both interested in learning just how well these new contraption could improve communications through their speed and efficiency. The rate for airmail postage was set at 24 cents and the stamps, depicting a Curtiss Jenny biplane were hastily printed only a few days prior to the first inaugural flight on May 15.

Meanwhile, an astute philatelist named William Robey, entered a New York post office and asked the attending clerk for a full sheet containing 100 of the New Jenny stamps. In his own words Robey recounted how the postal clerk, "brought forth a full sheet and my heart stood still". The image was printed upside down!! "It was a thrill that comes only once in a lifetime", said Robey, and knowing full well what this was worth on the philatelic market, he ventured to ask the clerk whether he had any more of such sheets. At this the clerk






was suspicious and closed his window to report this to his superiors. Robey understood that if he was to remain there any longer, his prize stamps could easily be confiscated, so he quietly left the post office and hid the stamps under his mattress. When postal authorities caught the news, they tried to hassle Robey into returning the stamps, but as far as the law was concerned, the stamps were legally bought over the counter and Robey soon sold the entire sheet for a cool \$15,000 - a fortune in those days. The postal clerk was interviewed in later years and when asked how he failed to spot such an obvious error he exclaimed he had never seen a biplane before so, "how was I to know whether it was the right way up or not?"

The sheet was subsequently sold for \$20,000 to Edward H.R. Green, an eccentric philatelist and millionaire who broke the sheet up into individual stamps and blocks of four to distribute amongst other collectors. Green even went as far as to have one of the inverted Jenny stamps framed back to back with another normal Jenny stamp within a gold framed glass locket as a gift to his wife Mabel Green, although rumours has it that she never wore the locket.

As one of the most classical stamp errors to date, an inverted Jenny stamp catalogues at around \$150,000 whilst a block of four fetches a staggering £600,000.

Stamp Issuers Past and Present A overprint (= Avianca)

## stamp terms used in PHILATEL

Accessories: are the aids available for the collectors like hinges and mounts of various sizes, magnifiers, tweezers, perforation and measurement gauges, colour guides, albums etc.

Advertising by Postmark: some postal agencies use special postmarks to advertise. This kind of advertising began during the First World War. Since then many slogan cancellations have been used for Government publicity. Holiday resorts, towns and villages, governmental agencies are the ones who usually use postmarks advertising.

Aerogramme: This is the official U.P.U. name for airletter sheet. These are lightweight sheets with gummed flaps and usually with a stamp printed on them. These are carried by air at less than normal airmail rates. The first aerogramme was issued in Iraq in July 1933. They became very popular with the armed forces during the last World War. It is a recognised philatelic sideline.

*Aero-Philately:* The collection and study of postage stamps for use on airborne mail

Agency: This term has two meanings in philately namely:

- A postal agency operated by the Post Office of one a)
- country in the territory of another. An organisation of either public or private enterprise handling b) and promoting sales of new issues to the stamp trade on behalf of the issuing government e.g. the Crown Agents.







## **GOZITAN PERSONALITIES**

Anton Said Micallef On the 18th October 2002 Maltapost issued a set of five stamps featuring prominent people. It is worth noting that among these there are two Gozitans namely: Sir Adrian Dingli and Archpriest Saverio Cassar. Therefore it is opportune to give a short biography of these two Gozitans.



### <u>Sir Adrian Dingli 1817 - 1900</u>

Sir Adrian Dingli was born in Valletta. His father was the Gozitan Sir Paolo Dingli. Adrian was educated at the Mdina Seminary and later at the University of Malta from where he graduated Doctor of Laws at the age of 19. He continued his studies at various universities in Europe.

He entered politics and in 1849 was elected to represent Gozo in the Government Council. He was instrumental in setting up of Gozo as an Independent Diocese in 1864.

In 1853 was appointed Crown Advocate. He was made Knight Commander of the Order of St Michael and St George in 1857. In 1878 he acted as temporary Legal Advisor to Sir Garnet Wolseley who was High Commissioner and Commander-in-Chief. In 1880 Sir Adrian Dingli was appointed Chief Justice



and president of the Court of Appeals. In 1893 he was nominated Vice-President of the Council of Government. He served on very important diplomatic missions amongst which were those in London , Tunis, Cyprus and Turin. Sir Adrian's greatest contribution was his compilation of Malta's reformed Code of Civil and Commercial Law. The building of the Theatre Royal and the Valletta Market were built due to his pressure on the administration of that time.

Sir Adrian Dingli retired after 40 years service in public life at the age of 77. Sir Arthur Fremantle, Governor of Malta 1894-98 spoke highly of him and remarked that he should always be remembered amongst the greatest Maltese personalities who rendered sterling service to the general public. #### Archpriest Francesco Saverio Cassar 1746 - 1805

Francesco Saverio was born on December 29th 1746 in the neighbourhood known as ta' Santa Cecilja in the district of Ghajnsielem, limits of the parish of Nadur where he was also baptised. It is believed that the old house where he was born is still prominently standing at the above mentioned site.

He studied in Rome where he graduated Doctor of Divinity at the University of La Sapienza and while he was still there, was ordained as a priest by His Excellency Mons. Francesco Mattei, Patriarch of Alexandria on March 30th 1771. Two years later on April 20th 1773 when he was still in Rome was appointed archpriest of the Church Matrix of Gozo at the age of twenty seven because his uncle archpriest Giacomo Galea had retired. He took office on December 6th of the same year. Shortly after he returned to Gozo, Bishop Carmine Joannes Pallezano chose him to be his representative in Gozo.

Rev Archrpiest F Saverio Cassar did a great deal for the Church Matrix in Gozo. But he is mostly remembered for his part played when the French were expelled from the island.



On September 18th 1798 a Congress was founded to organize the blockade of the 217 French soldiers and officers in the Citadel. The congress chose F Saverio Cassar as Head of the temporary government and Chief Superintendent of the island. In this government there were representatives from Rabat, Xewkija, Sannat, Gharb, Zebbug, Xaghra and Nadur.

The blockade was under the leadership of Archpriest Cassar who had set up his quarters on Gelmus Hill from where he could well observe the movements of the enemy in the Citadel. Meanwhile he asked for help from Sicily, but the first to arrive to the rescue on September 19th was the Marquis de Niza, Portugese with five sea crafts, and on September 22nd George Henry Cagl arrived too. On October 24th Sir Horatio Nelson Vice Admiral of the British Fleet arrived on his frigate Vanguard. That same evening Archpriest Cassar had a meeting with Nelson on the frigate and they discussed the articles of the capitulation and how the French were to be convinced to accept it.

On October 27th Captain Alexander John Ball crossed over to Gozo to make the enemy sign the capitulation. The French realizing that help from outside was quite remote, signed the agreement on Sunday October 28th 1798. With the last French soldier out of the Citadel, the White Ensign came up flying by the Captain of the British Marines John Creswell. The following day Monday October 29th Capt. John Creswell passed the rule of the Citadel and the island to Archpriest F Saverio Cassar. Strictly speaking during this time Gozo and Comino in theory still made part of the Kingdom of Sicily, though in reality they enjoyed some sort of independence up to September 5th 1800, when the capitulation of the French in Malta was signed and the Maltese Islands came under British protection.

Archpriest Cassar will be also remembered for starting the ball rolling asking the authorities for Gozo to be a diocese, which became a reality when Rev Mikiel Frangisk Buttigieg was Archpriest of il-"Matrici."

Rev Arch Francesco Cassar died on December 16th 1805.




