

Gozo data:

The Household Budgetary Survey 2000

The Household Budgetary Survey of 2000 provides some interesting socio-economic details about the Gozitans.

Household size:

- 12.5% with one person;
- 42.0% with two or three persons;
- 40.2% with four or five persons;
- 5.3% with six person or more.

Economic activity:

- 57.4% are employed;
- 39.8% are inactive*;
and
- 2.7% are unemployed.

*Inactive people are those who are 15 years old and over and include pensioners and housewives. Gozo has the highest proportion of inactive reference persons.
