Unrestricted information


Improve access to research


Develop sense of belonging to the Institution

Result? University Libraries have to pick and choose between journal subscriptions.

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The Debate

A long standing debate

Make research/school work accessible



The work is shared, not constrained by paywalls and legal regimes

Financial barriers, therefore limiting the access of research

Students are a large stakeholder





Complete Education:

Access to latest research

Beneficial for their first career experience

More Information = Prioritise the relevance of the information

Updated Knowledge



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Better Learning Experience

Not available for professors; Not available for students

Professors need to keep uptodate

Teach what what is accessible rather than what needs to be known

Beneficial for career building



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Search for Papers

Easy to cite from peer- reviewed journals

Once online, students/ academics have access

Have access to a wide range



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Level Playing Field

The accessibility does not depend on funds of the institution

No institution can provide a complete scholarly record

No limits to resources

Knowledge-elite





Better Visibility

Make the work available to anyone interested

More Readers = More Recognition



Studies show that open access articles are cited by other authors more frequently than comparable article which have restricted access

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
No Limits to Knowledge

Altruistic idea regarding knowledge

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


A survey of PhD. Students and Posdocs at Max Planck Institutes across Germany
