Activities at the Gozo University Centre

8th April 2001: Lace Day was organised in which speeches by the Hon. Giovanna Debono, Ms Consiglia Azzopardi, Prof Lino Briguglio and Mgr Fortunato Mizzi were made. A number of items related to Lace Making were exhibited. In addition a number of stands were set up dealing with the International Organisation of Needle and Bobbin Lace.

15th June 2001: A public lecture by Prof. Hajime Oshiro was held at the Gozo Centre. The lecture was entitled "The Economy of Okinawa".

31st August 2001 - The Presentation of Certificates. The event was introduced by the Director of the Centre, Prof Lino Briguglio. The Hon. Giovanna Debono, who presented the certificates, stated that the University Gozo Centre has proved to be a success story. She said that the Centre provide an opportunity for Gozitans to access tertiary education.

3rd November 2001 - Public Lecture entitled "A greater future for Gozo's Golden Quarries" by Dr Tony Cadmann. (reproduced above). During the lecture Dr Cadmann proposed a number of opportunities for Gozitan quarry owners to improve the profitability of the quarries themselves with beneficial repercussion for the environment.
