




More than a third would like to get vaccinated as soon as possible in Malta (41%), Ireland (37%) and Denmark (35%), while at least a third declare that they would never get vaccinated in Bulgaria (34%) and Slovenia (33%)

THE NEED TO ENGAGE & INVOLVE SOCIETY

- The rise and spread of fake news, misinformation, mistrust in media & experts (although COVID has increased trust in researchers and medical practitioners)
- To address many of the world's global societal challenges many different groups need to work with research & innovation actors
- Many buzz words: Informed democracy, active citizenship, knowledge-based economy, evidence-based policy
 - need to happen

WHY ENGAGED RESEARCH?

The Changing Role of Academia

- -Need to address the lack of trust in expertise and academic research
- -Need to address negative narrative of "Us vs Them"; university as an "Ivory Tower"
- -Need to create more impactful research and enable partners and publics to better understand, appreciate and contribute to the value of academic research

WHAT IS RRI?

Responsible Research and Innovation (RRI) implies that societal actors (researchers, citizens, policy makers, business, third sector organisations, etc.) work together during the whole research and innovation process in order to better align both the process and its outcomes with the values, needs and expectations of society




MAINSTREAMING RRIINMALTA

INTERNAL STUDY

- University of Malta (UM) performed an internal study to understand the situation and perception of RRI at UM.
- To achieve this we did an online questionnaire to all staff and students (226 responses) and semi-structured interviews (29)
- We also reviewed internal structures, policies and documents

Accountability vs social responsibility



RESULTS

- Dichotomous narrative of "Us vs Them" rather than relational (e.g. co-production, co-development, active listening)
- Power dynamics influencing best practices and research outcomes, as well as governance structure
- Informal networks over formal procedures

ADDRESSING THE RESEARCH FINDINGS


- Setting up of CRE Committee for Research Engagement that includes internal and external stakeholders. It is tasked to review the policies of the University of Malta and embed RRI it within the institution.
- Setting up of an executive arm that can carry out the tasks the committee deems the most important in accordance with top management and other stakeholders.
