(CAP. 327)**

**Bye-Laws of 2014 in terms of the General Regulations for  
University Undergraduate Awards, 2004 for the  
Diploma in Policing – Dip. Pol. -  
under the auspices of the Faculty for Social Wellbeing**

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by sections 74 (5) and 75 (6) of the Education Act (Cap. 327), the Chancellor of the University of Malta has promulgated the following bye-laws made by the Board of the Faculty for Social Wellbeing in virtue of the powers conferred upon it by section 81 (1) (c) of the said Act and which have been approved by the Senate of the University of Malta as required by section 81(2) of the said Act:

**Citation and Interpretation**

1. (1) These bye-laws may be cited as the Bye-Laws of 2014 in terms of the General Regulations for University Undergraduate Awards, 2004 for the Diploma in Policing – Dip. Pol. - under the auspices of the Faculty for Social Wellbeing.

(2) In these bye-laws, unless the context otherwise requires –

"the Board" means the Board of the Faculty for Social Wellbeing;

"the Board of Studies" means the Board of Studies appointed by Senate for the Course, on the recommendation of the Board;

"the Course" means the programme of study leading to the Diploma in Policing – Dip. Pol.;

"the Diploma" means the Diploma in Policing – Dip. Pol.; and

"the Principal Regulations" means the General Regulations for University Undergraduate Awards, 2004.

**Applicability**

2. These bye-laws shall be applicable for courses commencing in October 2014 or later.

### **Requirements for Admission**

3. (1) To be registered as regular students in the Course, applicants shall satisfy the general entry requirements for admission as specified in the Admission Regulations of the University.

(2) Applicants may also be admitted under sub-paragraph (a) (iii) of paragraph (2) of regulation 2 of the Admission Regulations. Such applicants must be in possession of those qualifications and/or experience that would satisfy the Faculty Admissions Committee that they have reached the academic standard required to follow the Course with profit. The eligibility of such applicants shall be decided by the Faculty Admissions Committee, following an interview conducted by an interviewing board, composed of at least three persons, appointed for the purpose.

(3) All applicants referred to paragraphs (1) and (2) of this bye-law shall be members of the Malta Police Force holding an appointment of Probationary Police Inspectors. Such applicants shall be nominated by the Commissioner of Police.

### **Course Duration**

4. The Course shall extend over a period of one year of full-time study.

#### **Applicable for courses commencing in October 2019 or later:**

### **Course Duration**

4. The Course shall extend over two semesters of full-time study or four semesters of part-time study.

### **Course Programme**

5. (1) The Course shall consist of study-units to which not less than 60 ECTS credits shall be assigned, in areas of studies directly related to police work and to studies supportive to policing.

(2) The programme of study shall be published after approval by Senate, normally not less than eight months prior to the commencement of the Course.

## **Assessment**

6. (1) Students who fail in study-units to which not more than 16 ECTS credits are assigned shall be given the opportunity to re-sit the failed assessment/s during the September supplementary examination session.

(2) Students who after the supplementary session need not more than 10 ECTS credits in order to successfully complete the Course may refer the failed study-unit/s to an additional year of study.

(3) Students who fail in more than 16 ECTS credits or in 10 ECTS credits after re-assessment may be allowed to repeat the Course in its entirety, when the course is next offered.

## **Classification of the Award**

7. (1) The Final Weighted Average Mark for the purpose of the classification of the Diploma shall be based on the results obtained in the Course, all credits being weighted equally.

(2) The names of students who qualify for the award of the Diploma shall be published in a list in alphabetical order classified as follows:

Pass with Distinction  
Pass with Merit  
Pass.

## **Repeal**

8. The Bye-Laws of 2006 in terms of the General Regulations for University Undergraduate Awards, 2004 for the Diploma in Policing under the auspices of the Institute of Forensic Studies, published as Legal Notice 309 of 2006, shall be deemed to cease to be in force as from the 30 September 2014, provided that students registered for this course before 1<sup>st</sup> October 2014 shall continue to be governed by the bye-laws that were in force at the time of their joining the course.
