

Student representation on Boards of Studies



Students are the primary stakeholders of any Higher Education Institution, so empowering the students' voice is essential in safeguarding the quality of educational outcomes. The active participation of students in their educational journey is ultimately what helps them transcend from being mere passive receivers of information to being engaged co-creators in a meaningful learning experience.

At UM, various channels are made available to students to express their ideas, concerns, opinions and feedback regarding every aspect of their University life. One of the most pertinent formal avenues for this active participation is the representation of students on **Boards of Studies**. Student representatives on such Boards of Studies are selected via an election organised directly by the respective Faculty, Institute, Centre or School (FICS), as opposed to student representatives on the FICS Board, which entails a process facilitated by the Office of the Registrar.

FICS are thus responsible for planning and executing the selection or election process for student representatives on their Boards of Studies. The Quality Assurance Committee encourages FICS to further announce the appointed student representatives on their respective webpages, in the interest of ensuring that all students are made aware of who their representatives are.
