This programme of study aims to fill a gap in this much needed area of specialisation. Students are provided with sound underpinning knowledge and the necessary skills to work professionally in settings related to human resources. The programme of studies covers the following six major themes: Work, Labour Market and Society; Organisational Behaviour and Development; Industrial and Employee Relations; Work Design and Occupational Health and Safety; Personal and Occupational Skills Development; and Research.

Students who successfully complete 60 credits and do not continue the course will be awarded a **Diploma in Work and Human Resources**.
