

All performance pieces are to be chosen from the Repertoire Lists in Appendix 3.

Candidates are to show their expressive skills and ability to understand stylistic features as well as apply musical concepts through their performance.

Candidates are to choose **TWO** pieces from the repertoire list, one from List A and one from List B for their chosen instrument. Each piece will carry equal marks (12.5 marks each). Candidates will also be given a piece to play at sight (5 marks). Instrumentalists are required to provide their own piano accompanist (if needed) on the date and time indicated in the timetable.

With the exception of the pianoforte, all other candidates are required to bring their own instruments. All da capo and dal segno indications should be observed. Other repeats should be omitted unless these are a few bars length. Candidates are encouraged to play from memory but no additional marks will be awarded if they choose to do so.
