

Guidelines for the Selection of Scholars of Repute on Boards of Institutes, Centres and Schools at the University of Malta

Some boards of Institutes, Schools and Centres have the opportunity to select and appoint scholars of repute to join them and support their work in a variety of ways.

These guidelines serve to outline the selection criteria to be used by Boards to recommend scholars of repute every year to Senate.

The proposed *scholar of repute* should have two or more of the following qualities:

- has contributed to advancements of relevance to the field internationally or locally;
- be an authority on a subject matter of relevance to the field, with a strong track record of publications;
- has a positive track record of engagement with the development and operations of the Institute/Centre/School, and/or collaborates and supports the Institute/Centre/School programmes and/or research endeavours.

A scholar of repute is expected to:

- be in a position to attend meetings held by the Institute/Centre/School where appropriate;
- contribute to the scholarly initiatives of the Institute, Centre or School as may be required; and
- help promote the institution's work where appropriate.
