


 Career development question: MSCA fellowship is designed to significantly add to the career development of the fellow. What should the fellow expect to achieve in terms of career development?

- In addition to those funded under the IF call, around 35-40 Widening fellowships are awarded each year to researchers applying to undertake their fellowship in a Widening country
- No restrictions on nationalities
- Implemented under the Spreading excellence and Widening participation part of Horizon 2020
- Budget:
