Erasmus+ Framework

☐ To participate in different actions under Erasmus+ Programme HEIs need to apply for and be awarded an Erasmus Charter for Higher Education.

- ☐ UM had it's ECHE renewed in 2020 for the next programming period 2021-2027
- Erasmus HEI mobility operates on a framework of Inter-Institutional Agreements within which mobility takes place





Erasmus+ Student Mobility



Erasmus+ Student mobility

- Two types of mobilities: for studies and for traineeships
- All registered students at University of Malta (undergraduate, postgraduate and doctoral level)
- A student may participate in mobility periods totalling up to 12 months for each study cycle (UG, PG and PhD).
- Study mobilities must take place during designated mobility semesters (usually at UG level)
- Student mobilities for traineeships are more flexible in terms of scope, timing and host organisation



Erasmus+ Student mobility for Traineeship

- Duration 2 to 12 months
- Eligible for different study cycles (UG, PG, PhD)
- Students may carry out research traineeships or actual work placement



Support provide by the Erasmus+ Programme

- Framework
- ☐ Financial Support to undertake the mobility
- Inclusion Support

 Formerly referred to as special needs support which aims to address personal, physical, mental or health-related conditions which could possibly hinder participation in Erasmus+, unless participants are provided with additional support.



Erasmus+ Student Mobility Grants *

Travel Support


Travel distances	Amount
Between 10 and 99 KM:	EUR 20 per participant
Between 100 and 499 KM:	EUR 180 per participant
Between 500 and 1999 KM:	EUR 275 per participant
Between 2000 and 2999 KM:	EUR 360 per participant
Between 3000 and 3999 KM:	EUR 530 per participant
Between 4000 and 7999 KM:	EUR 820 per participant
8000 KM or more:	EUR 1500 per participant

Travel Support is a one time payment to each participant

Individual Support is calculated as follows: Duration of Mobility x monthly rate for the destination country

Example

Mary will go on mobility to the University of Oslo, Norway for 4.5 months Individual support eligible = 4.5 x € 770 euro p/month = €3375




Erasmus+ Staff Mobility



Erasmus+ Staff Mobility

- Two types of Staff Mobility: for Training and for Teaching
- Members of staff holding a council appointment are eligible to apply
- Applications consist of a number of questions related to personal information, the Erasmus+ mobility experience and participation in Erasmus+ (in general)
- Applications are assessed by 2 international independent assessors are consolidated
- Results are confirmed by the Erasmus+ Staff Grant Allocation Committee Chaired by the Director, IO and has HRMD and UMASA as board members. Also discuss specific situations and decisions in relation to the award of Staff Mobility



Erasmus+ Staff Mobility

Duration maybe between 2 days and 2 months.
 Call may be issued setting a specific limit to duration

- Priority to first time applicants
- Eligibility period set in the call for applications
- Staff mobility for Teaching require a minimum of 8 hours teaching per week
- Staff Mobilities can be Teaching and Training combined in which case minimum teaching is reduced to 4 hours week



	Max per day up to 14th day after which rate is reduced to 70%

Belgium, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Greece, France, Italy, Cyprus, Luxembourg, Hungary, Austria, Poland, Romania, Finland, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Turkey	€140
Germany, Spain, Latvia, Malta , Portugal, Slovakia, former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia	€120
Estonia, Croatia, Lithuania, Slovenia	€100

Erasmus+ International Credit Mobility

Opportunity for HEI to undertake exchanges with partners for non-EU/EEA countries

Also based on Inter-Institutional Agreements

Funding focusing solely on mobilities but this action can be used to support cooperation with non-EU/EEA countries

 Erasmus+ ICM requires a very detail application and is evaluated in a different manner than the European Erasmus+

UM is waiting for the new version of the Erasmus+ ICM to be made available late in 2021.
