## MONHE Dissertation Writing Styles

The MONHE Dissertation writing styles must follow <u>the UM Library guidelines for dissertation</u> <u>document development</u>.

Unless otherwise stated in the UM Library Guidelines for postgraduate dissertations:

- Line spacing should be at 1.5 line,
- Font style should be Calibri and font size 12 pts unless otherwise specified
  - First level headings title of the chapter should be in bold with a font size of 16 and with an initial capital letter for any proper noun
  - Second level headings (for instance Introduction) should be in bold with an initial capital letter for any proper noun
  - Third level headings should be in bold italics with an initial capital letter for any proper nouns
  - Fourth level headings should be in italics with an initial capital letter for any proper nouns
- Quotations of more than thirty words should be single-spaced and forma distinct paragraph without indentation
- Tables and Figures: should be numbered and given a title below the right-hand side of the figure and table, with a font size of 11
- Citations and references must be consistent and accurately following the <u>7<sup>th</sup> Edition of the</u> <u>APA Referencing Style</u>
- Spelling and punctuation: Use British style consistently
- Word limit count As stipulated in the MONHE study program bye-laws, the word limit of the MONHE dissertation is 20,000 words:
  - References and notes (inc. footnotes and endnotes) are to be included in the word count.
  - Quotations (from gathered data), appendices, tables and figures are NOT to be included in the word count.
