Assessment indicators – PROJECT REPORT

Where and as applicable:

Coherence: the degree to which the work is unified by being logical and consistent through a clear relationship between parts.

Clarity: the writing communicates effectively with the reader through clearly written prose (well-constructed sentences, logical organisation, and precise word choice) including a presentation of the issues under study.

Methodology and Rationale: clearly stated reasons or explanations providing a logical basis for the course of action taken including justification of the chosen design and methodology.

^{*}Given the varied nature of Project-based dissertations, and to provide flexibility for the examiners, the 20% mark 'as deemed applicable', may be assigned *in toto* or part, to either the Project/Activity and/or the Project Report, as deemed appropriate by the members of the Board of Examiners.

Engagement with relevant literature: use and knowledge of the literature. Key works are cited and discussed. There is the intelligent use of the literature (not haphazard inclusions of stumbled-upon works) through an integrative approach and theoretical background explanation.

Expected benefits/contributions, including the objectives of the project/activity and underlying philosophy. **Strengths and limitations**, as well as suggestions for future research and/or similar initiatives.

Challenges faced and how these were mitigated and/or overcome.

Reflection and critical analysis on educational matters including the accurate identification of the pedagogical area.

Originality: the degree by which the work is distinctive from similar projects.

Referencing: Correct and consistent referencing and a stated referencing style adopted.

Assessment indicators - PROJECT / ACTIVITY

Where and as applicable:

Quality: the standard of the work attained, including distinctive characteristics and the degree of excellence reached.

Safety issues: the work does not cause danger, harm, risk or injury. Any mitigation that was employed to ensure safety.

Ethical principles: adherence to ethical principles of conduct, as pertinent to the project field and/or setting.

Organization: the degree of structure, arrangement or preparation undertaken. Planned and controlled project/activity resulting in orderly and efficient work.

Achievement of objectives: the level to which the work has achieved its intended purpose.

IMPORTANT - 6 points regarding students' evaluation or testing of Projects/ Activity

- 1. Evaluation is not obligatory for a Project-based dissertation.
- 2. While some students might want to do some evaluation or testing, this should be performed only on a light basis (very small scale).
- 3. This can be discussed in the write-up introducing and accompanying the Project.
- 4. No marks will be deducted for students' work that does not contain any evaluation.
- 5. It is suggested that students might simply indicate 'how' the project could be evaluated, but not actually carrying out such an evaluation.
- 6. Literature backing the project's justification should be included in the write-up.

Students should consult with the MTL Dissertation Committee (through the Secretary Ms Denise Spiteri) on how to best submit and/or record the actual project/activity for examination by the Board of Examiners. All material is to be retained until at least a month after publication of results
