Addendum:

- i. Unless indicated otherwise, all courses/qualifications referred to in this document are offered/awarded by the University of Malta (UM).
- ii. A Course Application Fee shall apply accordingly prior to submitting a course application. Once accepted in a course, Annual Enrollment Fees and/or Bench Fees may also apply. Further information regarding all fees is available online here: https://www.um.edu.mt/study/feesfunding/
- iii. All paid applications received towards courses at UM shall undergo a diligent vetting process. Such process may take a number of weeks to be complete.

 Once this process is concluded, an official UM letter indicating the outcome of course application shall be sent to the applicant accordingly.
- iv. The commencement of any course is subject to availability of resources. If an insufficient number of qualified applicants, or if adequate supervision is unavailable, the University reserves the right not to offer courses / areas of study. Other courses may also be added/offered in due course during the application period.
- v. The University's academic year is divided in two semesters: the first semester runs from October to January, whilst the second semester runs from February to May. Some postgraduate courses may also include a summer semester (June to September).
- vi. Lectures relating to courses offered on a FT and PT Day basis may be held from Monday to Friday between 0800 and 2000 hours. Lectures for PT evening courses may be held from Monday to Friday between 1600 and 2000 hours. The University shall announce the days on which a course is to be held prior to its commencement. However, it cannot be bound by fixed days and times for the duration of the whole course. Applicants are encouraged to consult the respective Faculty/Institute/Centre/School for further information.
- vii. Master's degrees programmes which are offered 'By Research' may have multiple entry points. Please contact the respective F/I/C/S/A to ascertain which entry points may be available, after which you may proceed to apply accordingly indicating which entry point you wish to be admitted in.
- viii. The University also offers doctoral degrees (Doctor of Philosophy, Doctor of Music, and Doctor of Sacred Theology) on a full-time or part-time basis for which applications are received at any time of the year. Tuition, annual enrolment, and bench fees may apply.

- x. FOR COURSES WITH A LIMITED NUMBER OF STUDENTS, the following conditions apply:
 - No late course applications are accepted (Unless otherwise indicated in this list and/or advised accordingly by the Admissions & Records office)
 - For those applicants who i) apply by the first deadline, ii) are fully qualified, and iii) have submitted all required documents by 31 August will be considered first and placed in rank order according to the selection criteria approved by Senate. Those for whom places are available will be informed accordingly.
 - Subsequently, if any vacant places remain available after this initial ranking process, those other applicants fulfilling all the Entry Requirements and any other requirements imposed by the respective F/I/C/A/S (including the submission of documentation by a set time period), shall be considered for selection to take up any remaining places.
