Nature Trust - FEE

Nature Trust is an organisation which aims to protect Maltese nature and the environment.

There are different volunteering options available:

- help at one of their Natura 2000 sites with removal of alien invasive plant species, watering of plants/trees and planting indigenous plants. This would be mostly at Wied Ghollieqa on University grounds. Hours would be determined by the site manager.
- help at the Wildlife Rehab Centre in Xrobb L-Għaġin, where students would be helping with cleaning enclosures/tanks and feeding of wildlife in rehab, mostly sea turtles and hedgehogs, with the occasional chameleon, snake or skink. Hours are usually 9am-2pm weekdays or 10am-2pm weekends.
- between 1st May to the end of August, patrolling beaches looking for nesting turtles/tracks indicating turtle nests. The morning checks are carried out at 5:30am and usually last around 30 minutes. The evening patrols are carried out from 9pm-midnight. Beaches that are monitored include Ramla l-Hamra in Gozo, and Ghadira, Golden Bay, Riviera, Gnejna and Mscala in Malta.

Victim Support Malta

Victim Support Malta (VSM) is a registered NGO (VO141/08) providing trauma-informed assistance to victims of all types of crime. Established as an independent organisation in 2008, VSM supports and empowers individuals whose lives have been affected by crime, suicide, or other traumatic events.

Volunteers/interns will assist in a range of administrative and communication duties, including:

- Administrative support: Contacting clients, inputting and managing data, and assisting with day-to-day office tasks.
- Social media and communications: Creating social media schedules, designing mini-campaigns (including reels, videos, and graphics), and supporting awareness-raising initiatives.
- Archiving and digitisation: Helping to digitise old files and maintain accurate, organised digital records.

Malta Classics Association

The Malta Classics Association is dedicated to the promotion and support of the study of Classics in Malta and abroad. Voluntary work with MCA would involve facilitating MCA events as well as team meetings.

The Spiritual Development in Schools Unit (SDS) within the Archdiocese of Malta aims to support schools in fostering spiritual development and pastoral care.

Volunteers will be tasked with content creation, simple videos and powerpoint presentations as well as help in SDS activities for school students.

Centro Astalli

Centro Astalli is a centre in Rome under the auspices of JRS Italy. It aims to accompany and serve refugees, asylum seekers and the poor. Volunteers can help out at the soup kitchen either by cooking or distributing food. Volunteers can also help by teaching English to refugees and distributing food to homeless people.

Volunteers are required to volunteer for a minimum of one week. Accommodation is also available on demand.

Blue Door Education

Blue Door Education is a non-profit organisation which offers literacy and English language classes for refugees, migrants and asylum seekers.

Tasks include setting up the classrooms, assisting teachers with lesson preparations, meeting and greeting students at the door, registering new students, maintaining student databases, as well as ensuring the premises are left clean and tidy for others to use. Students with CELTA or TEFL qualifications, or those who aspire to become teachers can also help with assistant teaching duties.

Migrant Women Association Malta

MWAM aims to support migrant, refugees and asylum-seeking women who fall within vulnerable groups. They offer professional, organisational and emotional advice to those in need whilst promoting personal empowerment.

One of the projects offered by MWAM is 'Sahha'. This project helps to promote integration and empowerment through employment. It also allows migrant women to share their love for cooking and meet regularly so as to prepare home-cooked meals.

MWAM is looking for a Logistics Coordinator and a 'Sahha' Coordinator to help out on a voluntary basis. Students interested in these posts need to be able to volunteer around 30 hours weekly. MWAM are also in need of casual volunteers to help out during their events.
